Shelly from The Good Acre also made an appearance and talked about the programs that offered there.
	B. Garden-In-A-Box Started in 2008, the Garden-in-a-Box program was created by Minnesota State Horticulture Society to teach vegetable gardening to kids so they would eat more fresh produce. MSHS distributes vegetable gardening kits to community groups.
	The program provides an opportunity for children and families in need to experience the benefits of gardening: affordable healthy food, outdoor activity, education and community building. It gives childcare providers, community program coordinators and teachers the chance to incorporate hands-on learning experiences into their programs.
	The City of Falcon Heights will be partnering with the MSHS for the Garden-In-A-Box Program. The boxes will be placed at Falcon Heights Elementary, City Hall and at Sr. Apartment Complexes.


