CITY OF LAKE ELMO CITY COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 2, 2014

Mayor Pearson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

PRESENT: Mayor Mike Pearson and Council Members Wally Nelson, Justin Bloyer, and Mike Reeves

Absent: Council Member Anne Smith

Staff present: City Administrator Zuleger, City Attorney Snyder, Community Development Director Klatt, Finance Director Bendel, and City Clerk Bell.

PLEDGE OF ALLIGENCE

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Item 10 was postponed.

MOTION: Council Member Reeves moved TO APPROVE THE AUGUST 19, 2014 CITY COUNCIL AGENDA AS AMENDED. Council Member Nelson seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

ITEM 1: ACCEPT MINUTES

THE AUGUST 19, 2014 CITY COUNCIL MINUTES WERE APPROVED AS AMENDED BY CONSENSUS OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Mayor Pearson: attended Human Resources Committee Meeting, EDA Meeting

Council Member Bloyer: attended library board meeting

Council Member Reeves: attended Human Resources Committee Meeting. The group worked on

performance reviews and salary pool. **Council Member Nelson:** no report.

PUBLIC COMMENTS/INQUIRIES

Paul Ryberg introduced Nate Deprey the new library director. Mr. Deprey expressed he is looking forward to working with the Council and the City.

STATUS OF 100% DEVELOPER INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT POLICY

City Administrator Zuleger provided status presentation of the developer paid infrastructure. The policy of "growth pays for growth" was implemented in 2013. This has resulted in two positive bond ratings, including an increase from S&P. Council Member Reeves asked what the reaction has been from the developers. National and regional builders have understood the policy. Many have appreciated the discipline. There have been some who are not willing to come to Lake Elmo. Mayor Pearson recognized that the policy and staff's efforts are doing as much as possible to minimize the risk to the City.

ITEM 2: PROCLAMATION COMMUNITY MEDIA WEEK

Mayor Pearson read the proclamation recognizing the week of September 15th 2014 as Community Media Week.

MOTION: Council Member Reeves moved TO APPROVE THE OTHER CONSENT AGENDA AS AMENDED. Mayor Pearson seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

ITEM 8: LIBRARY BOARD APPOINTMENT - MARGO SIELENI

It was explained that Mayor Pearson appointed Ms. Sieleni during his report last meeting, but Clerk Bell prefers to have a formal vote with background documentation included for record purposes. Council Member Bloyer thanked Ms. Sieleni for volunteering to serve.

MOTION: Council Member Bloyer moved TO APPOINT MARGO SIELENI TO THE LAKE ELMO LIBRARY BOARD. Council Member Nelson seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

REGULAR AGENDA

ITEM 9: SAVONA SUBDIVISION CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT; RES. NO. 2014-66

Community Development Director Klatt provided summary explaining the reason for the CUP application. Townhome units on a private street require a CUP, which the part of the next phase of Savona will include. The requirement is to make sure that the City's needs are met in regards to the private street. The area that is involved was explained.

MOTION: Council Member Reeves moved TO ADOPT RESOLUTION NO. 2014-66, APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SINGLE FAMILY ATTACHED DWELLINGS WITHIN THE SAVONA SUBDIVISION THAT DO NOT HAVE FRONTAGE ON A PUBLIC STREET. Council Member Nelson seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

ITEM 11: APPROVE PROPOSED GENERAL LEVY AND PROPOSED 2015 BUDGET; *RES.* NO. 2014-67

Finance Director Bendel presented the proposed 2015 budget.

Council Member Bloyer left at 7:30 pm.

The general fund budget was explained. It was noted that the street maintenance expenses were now a permanent line item in budget. Ms. Bendel explained that the tax levy is staying level and the rate is actually decreasing.

Ms. Bendel summarized the library fund. The end year cash reserves were explained.

Council Member Bloyer returned at 7:34 pm.

Council Member Reeves asked about part-time staffing at library for 2014. There was none in 2014, but it is budgeted in 2015.

Mayor Pearson asked about Sanctuary neighborhood road. City Administrator Zuleger explained the steps that the City has taken. The road needs to be approved by MnDOT. It is believed that the developer funds are available to pay for some of it.

Ms. Bendel read letter from Roger Johnson requesting city contribution of minimum of \$20k for invasive species management on Olson/Demontreville Lakes. Council Member Bloyer noted that the previous June

request was only \$25K. He would be in favor of city contributing 1/3 if all the lakes were evenly supported. He would like to have place holder in budget. Mr. Bloyer noted that recent letter from DNR found no natural erosion occur this past spring.

Mr. Reeves believes the City should be engaged in treating the lakes, but he supports addressing all the lakes. He also wants to know more info about the VBWD study. The outflow of the water was discussed.

It was noted that O/D levels are anticipated to increase. VBWD does not believe that increasing the outflow can be achieved.

Mr. Zuleger explained the VBWD study. The consensus is to have a placeholder, but wait to hear study findings. Mr. Zuleger suggested that the Council commit funds from the storm water fund as the lake is a repository for storm water. Mr. Nelson wants to know if the watershed cities causing impact can be approached for contribution. Mr. Zuleger said the City can ask the DNR.

Mr. Reeves asked if signage was sufficient. Mr. Zuleger said it was. It was noted that too much signage can cause confusion. It was explained that the City has not participated in the past.

The Council discussed what the appropriate funding level and appropriate parties to pay. Council direction is that the lake property owners need to propose a plan where the City can collaborate. The consequences of using storm water funds were discussed. Future storm water expenses and needs are ahead for the Village drainage. The Council wants to make sure that the expenses are effective and the results are measurable.

Ms. Bendel summarized the proposed debt service fund levy.

MOTION: Mayor Pearson moved TO APPROVE GENERAL FUND LEVY OF \$2,421,588.00. Council Member Reeves seconded the motion.

The council acknowledged the tight budget that staff developed and the introduction of zero-based budgeting.

MOTION PASSED 4-0.

MOTION: Mayor Pearson moved TO APPROVE DEBT SERVICE LEVY OF \$484,814.00. Council Member Reeves seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

The Council discussed how the library has done a good job of being frugal. Even with the 10% statutory reduction, the library levy is still more than the requested budget. A 10% percent reduction results in a \$231,261.00. This is actually a 20% increase over the 2014 budget.

MOTION: Mayor Pearson moved TO APPROVE LIBRARY FUND BUDGET AND LEVY AT AMOUNT OF \$231,261.00. Council Member Nelson seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

Mr. Zuleger clarified the resulting levy components – General Fund Levy: \$2,421,588.00; G.O. Debt Levy: \$484,814.00; Library Levy: \$231,261.00; total levy: \$3,137,663.00.

MOTION: Mayor Pearson moved TO APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 2014-67 ADOPTING THE PRELIMINARY 2015 GENERAL FUND AND LIBRARY FUND ANNUAL BUDGET'S AND LEVIES. Council Member Reeves seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED 4-0.

ITEM 12: DISCUSSION ITEM: COUNCIL/STAFF INTERACTIONS

Mayor Pearson explained the reason for this item. Concerns about interactions with Council Member Smith have been brought to the Council's attention. Mayor Pearson noted that conversations were had and commitments to improve were made, but the incidents complained about allegedly have continued. The immediate concerns are exposing the City to potential legal liability and the non-recognition of staff chain of command. The Mayor asked Council for their suggestions.

It was noted that the discussion needs to be in an open meeting despite the desire to have it in private. The council wants there to be improvement. There have been demands for correction in the past, but there needs to be more improvement. There is concern about potential liability to the City. The Council also wants staff to have a healthy, productive, and safe work environment. The recent adoption of the civility initiative needs to be carried out, especially by council members. The Council wants things to be better.

MOTION: Mayor Pearson moved "WHEN COUNCIL MEMBER SMITH WISHES TO CONTACT A CITY STAFF MEMBER, SHE IS TO ARRANGE FOR ANOTHER COUNCIL MEMBER TO BE IN ATTENDANCE. STAFF IS DIRECTED TO CONFORM TO THIS PARAMETER AS WELL." Council Member Reeves seconded the motion.

The Mayor hopes that this action improves the situation as everyone desires and they would not have to address this any further. The Council discussed the logistics and the effectiveness of proposed motion. The consensus was the City has an obligation to do something. Whether to include phone calls and adding a timeframe on the restriction were considered, but the original motion was not modified.

MOTION PASSED 4-0.

STAFF REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

City Administrator Zuleger: Staff is working on completing several final plats; Planning Commission will be touring a Hans Hagen development in Blaine; working on 2015 CIP budget. Goal is to have workshop in late September; meeting with Washington County Sheriff Hutton next week; Working with Gateway Corridor group involving a Bus Rapid Transit route through Lake Elmo; EDA will be submitting the Planning Commission a resolution for an EDA zoning area.

City Attorney Snyder: handling routine matters with staff; reviewed lease for new city administrative space at 3880 Laverne.

Community Development Director Klatt: Planning Commission is busy reviewing development applications.

City Clerk Bell: reported that Lake Elmo Precinct 1 was randomly selected by the County Canvass Board for review. The precinct passed with no issues. Clerk Bell also announced that additional election judges are being sought for the general election.

Finance Director Bendel: working on August financials, certification of levy, and storm water assessments.

Mayor Pearson adjourned meeting at 8:34 pm.

Dear Mayor Pearson and City Council Members,

As the date nears for the completion and vote by the city council on the Feasibility Report for the 36th/37th Street Project, we would like to reiterate our position and ask that this letter be filed with our Petition dated July 1, 2014.

We respectfully request that the city council vote **against any type of road for our neighborhood**. We do not feel at this time that we need new roads. We live in the rural section of town. It is not necessary structurally or financially to upgrade our roads to the level proposed to the residents on May 15, 2014.

There have been discussions at the financial committee meetings about possibly putting the project off until 2017, due in part to the large amount of development coming to Lake Elmo. If a date of 2017 is chosen, at that time we would like to again be notified before any decisions are made, so that we may be a part of the discussion. In 2017, if all parties agree the streets need improvement, at that time we would request:

There be **NO**:

- * 4" water mains upgraded to 8"
- * curbs and gutters
- * a pavement subdrain system
- * roads widened to 12'

We oppose paying additional funds for unnecessary items at the cost of the residents and city, regardless of what year the roads are done. The two roads we have been using have provided us sufficient service for 45 years. A similar road would provide the same service, whenever the city makes the decision to redo the roads.

In the meantime, we do request that the city patch and/or repair the west end of 36th Street and as needed in the future to both streets, just as any other road in the city would be repaired.

SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUESTED: As part of its Consent Agenda, the City Council is asked to accept the August 2014 Financial Reporting Packet. No specific motion is needed as this is recommended to be part of the overall approval of the *Consent Agenda*.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The City of Lake Elmo has fiduciary authority and responsibility to conduct normal business operations and report the financial (unaudited) statement to the City Council. City guidelines suggest the Council be updated on a regular basis.

STAFF REPORT: Attached please find the comparative financial statements for the month of August 2014 reflecting the monthly and year to date detail, comparing the actual results to the 2014 Budget.

The most significant budget to actual variances are highlighted below:

Revenues:

- Building Permit revenue for the month was 3% below budget and the year to date results are 9% better than budget. There was one new home started in August bringing the year to date new home starts to 17 compared to 23 in 2013 and 20 in 2012. Although fewer homes, the valuation amount to date is very close to 2013 due to the average home values being greater than the values used to estimate revenues in the 2014 budget. In addition, a new commercial building permit was issued in August which was valued at \$1.4M.
- Zoning and subdivision fees are well above budget for the month due to the budget assuming there would be very few zoning exceptions requested. This has not been the case, resulting in \$6.7k in revenue for the month and \$14.4k on a year to date basis.
- Plan check fees for the month are 24% better than budget and the year to date results are 30% better than budget. As mentioned previously, the valuations are higher than projected resulting in the revenue also being higher than budgeted.
- Miscellaneous permits for August includes a special fuel tank permit for \$7.5k. Due to the unusual nature of this permit, it has been broken out.

Expenses:

Most departments were at or below budget for the month due to diligently managing expenditures to the bottom line. A few items to note:

- Administration In August a temporary employee was utilized to cover the front desk in the absence of the full-time employee. This expense shows up in contract services expense.
- Elections In August the election judge expenses were paid out and are reflected under part-time salaries. The expense was split between August and September in the budget resulting in the variance being a timing issue. It is anticipated that the full year expense will come in below budget.
- Police As mentioned in July, the cost for policing services is billed each year in two installments. The amounts were budgeted in June and December. The bill for the first half of the year was billed and paid 8/19/14 resulting in the timing related variance.
- Public Works The part time salaries are \$3k higher than budget for the month due to all salaries being budgeted in the full time salary line item. On a year to date basis, the sum of the two salary expense lines are above budget due to the extra costs for snow removal as well as the summer focus on street repairs.
- Streets Due to the summer focus on street repairs, the street maintenance expenses are higher than budgeted for the month but within the full year budgeted amount. New signs were purchased and installed throughout the City resulting in the majority of the expense. Contract services for August included the cost of \$4.5k to rent the spray-patcher for street repairs for a second month due to the good results in July.

- Tree Program In August the City Right of Way's were trimmed. This was budgeted to be done earlier in the summer. On a year to date basis the expense is 7% more than budgeted.
- Parks & Recreation As mentioned with Public Works, all salary costs were budgeted under full-time salaries. In total, the salaries are \$1.8k more than budget for the month and \$4k below budget on a year to date basis. Landscaping materials for the month were \$1.4k higher than budget due to having the resources available to focus on the parks initiative.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Based on the aforementioned, the staff recommends the City Council accept the attached August Financial Report.

The Well No. 4 Connecting Watermain Improvement Project is near completion and the final project costs remain within the authorized project budget. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 429 the council must declare the amount to be assessed against the benefiting properties and Call the Hearing on the Proposed Assessment for these improvements. The Assessment Hearing is proposed for October 21, 2014. The Final Assessment Roll must be certified to the County Auditor by November 30, 2014. Special assessments for this project were established as fixed amounts for a Trunk Watermain. Therefore the unit assessments remain unchanged with the final project costs.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is recommending that the city council approve, as part of the *Consent Agenda*, Resolution No. 2014-68, thereby declaring the costs to be assessed to be \$29,000; ordering the preparation of the proposed assessments with the unit assessments to be \$2,900 for each benefitting property; and Calling for the Hearing on the proposed Assessments for October 21, 2014 at or around 7:00 PM. A RESOLUTION DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED, ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT, AND CALLING FOR HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR THE WELL NO 4 CONNECTING WATERMAIN IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, a contract has been let for the Well No. 4 Connecting Watermain Improvements including trunk watermain improvements along 50^{th} Street between the Well 4 site and Lake Elmo Avenue and along Lake Elmo Avenue from 50^{th} Street to 43^{rd} Street; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the water improvements will be \$550,000; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk and City Engineer have prepared the proposed assessment roll and will maintain said assessment roll on file in the City offices for public inspection.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED,

- 1. The portion of the cost of such water improvement to be paid by the City is hereby declared to be \$521,000, and the portion of the cost to be assessed against benefited property owners is declared to be \$29,000.
- 2. The City Clerk, with the assistance of the City Engineer, has calculated the proper amount to be specially assessed for such improvements against every assessable lot, piece or parcel of land to be benefited by the improvements, and the Clerk has filed a copy of such proposed assessment in the City offices for public inspection.
- 3. Assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2015, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.61 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of the assessment resolution.
- 4. A public hearing shall be held on the 21st day of October, 2014, in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at or approximately after 7:00 P.M. to pass upon such proposed assessment. All persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment.
- 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and he shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. He shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearings.
- 6. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the entire assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Clerk. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of the assessment. A property owner may at any time thereafter, pay to

the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 21 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year

CITY OF LAKE ELMO NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT WELL NO. 4 CONNECTING WATERMAIN IMPROVEMENTS

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of Lake Elmo will meet in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at or approximately after 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, October 21, 2014, to consider, and possibly adopt, the proposed assessment against abutting property for the Well No. 4 Connecting Watermain Improvements. Adoption by the Council of the proposed assessment may occur at the hearing. The following describes the area proposed to be assessed:

• The amount to be specially assessed against each particular lot, piece, or parcel of land receiving an individual service stub located along 50th Street, from the Well 4 site to Lake Elmo Avenue, and along Lake Elmo Avenue, from 50th Street to 43rd Street, is \$2,900.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor on November 21, 2014, pay the entire assessment on such property to the City Clerk with interest accrued to the date of payment. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid to the City Clerk 30 days from the adoption of this assessment. You may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 (date assessment certified to County Auditor) or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year. If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is 4.61 percent per year.

Once assessments are certified to the County, the assessments are payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2015, and will bear interest at the rate of 4.61 percent per annum from the date of adoption of the assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of the assessment resolution until December 31, 2014. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Clerk's office. The total amount of the proposed watermain improvement assessment is \$29,000. The City contribution for the watermain improvement project is \$521,000. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the municipal clerk prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The Council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected property owners as it deems advisable.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the Mayor or Clerk within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the Mayor or Clerk.

The City Council is authorized in its discretion to defer the payment of an assessment for any homestead property owned by a person for whom it would be a hardship to make payment if the owner is 65 years of age or older and/or the owner is a person retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability or by a person who is a member of the Minnesota National Guard or other military reserves who is ordered into active military service, as defined in section 190.05 subdivision 5b or 5c, as stated in the person's military orders, for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. The owner must request a deferment of the assessment at or before the public hearing at which the assessment is adopted and make application on forms prescribed by the City Clerk within 30 days after the adoption.

Notwithstanding the standards and guidelines established by the City for determining a hardship, a deferment of an assessment may be obtained pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 435.193.

Calling a final assessment hearing follows state statute for assessing benefitting properties for the improvements constructed in 2014 following the City's Special Assessment Policy.

SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUESTED:

The City Council is respectfully requested to consider declaring costs to be assessed and calling for the final assessment hearing for the Lake Elmo Avenue Trunk Watermain Improvements. If removed from the consent agenda, the recommended motion for this action is as follows:

"Move to approve Resolution No. 2014-69; A Resolution Declaring Costs to be Assessed, Ordering Preparation of Proposed Assessment, and Calling for the Hearing on the Proposed Assessment for the Lake Elmo Avenue Trunk Watermain Improvements."

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY/BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Lake Elmo Avenue Trunk Improvement Project is currently under construction and the final project costs remain within the authorized project budget. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 429 the council must declare the amount to be assessed against the benefiting properties and Call the Hearing on the Proposed Assessment for these improvements. The Assessment Hearing is proposed for October 21, 2014. The Final Assessment Roll must be certified to the County Auditor by November 30, 2014. Special assessments for this project were established as fixed amounts for a Trunk Watermain. Therefore the unit assessments remain unchanged with the final project costs.

There are additional properties along the project corridor that have requested to connect to City water and have therefore been provided a service stub as part of the project. These properties are not included on the final assessment roll because they will be assessed separately from the public improvement process. These properties are being required to sign an agreement to waive the right to appeal the assessment.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is recommending that the city council approve, as part of the *Consent Agenda*, Resolution No. 2014-69, thereby declaring the costs to be assessed to be \$92,800; ordering the preparation of the proposed assessments with the unit assessments to be \$2,900 for each benefitting property; and Calling for the Hearing on the proposed Assessments for October 21, 2014 at or around 7:00 PM. The recommended motion is as follows:

WHEREAS, a contract has been let for the Lake Elmo Avenue Trunk Watermain Improvements including trunk watermain improvements along Lake Elmo Avenue from 30^{th} Street south to future 5^{th} Street; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the water improvements will be \$2,498,800 and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk and City Engineer have prepared the proposed assessment roll and will maintain said assessment roll on file in the City offices for public inspection.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED,

- 1. The portion of the cost of such water improvement to be paid by the City is hereby declared to be \$2,406,000, and the portion of the cost to be assessed against benefited property owners is declared to be \$92,800.
- 2. The City Clerk, with the assistance of the City Engineer, has calculated the proper amount to be specially assessed for such improvements against every assessable lot, piece or parcel of land to be benefited by the improvements, and the Clerk has filed a copy of such proposed assessment in the City offices for public inspection.
- 3. Assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2015, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.61 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of the assessment resolution.
- 4. A public hearing shall be held on the 21st day of October, 2014, in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at or approximately after 7:00 P.M. to pass upon such proposed assessment. All persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment.
- 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and he shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. He shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearings.
- 6. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the entire assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Clerk. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of the assessment. A property owner may at any time thereafter, pay to

the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 21 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year

CITY OF LAKE ELMO NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT LAKE ELMO AVENUE TRUNK WATERMAIN IMPROVEMENTS

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of Lake Elmo will meet in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at or approximately after 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, October 21, 2014, to consider, and possibly adopt, the proposed assessment against abutting property for the Lake Elmo Avenue Trunk Watermain Improvements. Adoption by the Council of the proposed assessment may occur at the hearing. The following describes the area proposed to be assessed:

• The amount to be specially assessed against each particular lot, piece, or parcel of land receiving a new individual service stub located along Lake Elmo Avenue North from 30th Street to future 5th Street is \$2,900.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor on November 21, 2014, pay the entire assessment on such property to the City Clerk with interest accrued to the date of payment. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid to the City Clerk 30 days from the adoption of this assessment. You may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 (date assessment certified to County Auditor) or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year. If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is 4.61 percent per year.

Once assessments are certified to the County, the assessments are payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2015, and will bear interest at the rate of 4.61 percent per annum from the date of adoption of the assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of the assessment resolution until December 31, 2014. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Clerk's office. The total amount of the proposed watermain improvement assessment is \$92,800. The City contribution for the watermain improvement project is \$2,406,000. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the municipal clerk prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The Council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected property owners as it deems advisable.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the Mayor or Clerk within 30 days

after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the Mayor or Clerk.

The City Council is authorized in its discretion to defer the payment of an assessment for any homestead property owned by a person for whom it would be a hardship to make payment if the owner is 65 years of age or older and/or the owner is a person retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability or by a person who is a member of the Minnesota National Guard or other military reserves who is ordered into active military service, as defined in section 190.05 subdivision 5b or 5c, as stated in the person's military orders, for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. The owner must request a deferment of the assessment at or before the public hearing at which the assessment is adopted and make application on forms prescribed by the City Clerk within 30 days after the adoption.

Notwithstanding the standards and guidelines established by the City for determining a hardship, a deferment of an assessment may be obtained pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 435.193.

SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUESTED:

As part of its Consent Agenda, the City Council is requested to consider authorization for John Schiltz, owner and operator of Lake Elmo Inn, a municipal retail on-sale liquor license holder to dispense beer and wine coolers off premises and allow for consumption within the parameters set for the City's Volksmarch event on October 11, 2014. As part of the Consent Agenda, no formal motion is required. If Council wishes to further discuss this authorization, they can remove this item from the Consent Agenda and approve the authorization by taking the following action:

"Move to authorize John Schiltz, owner and operator of Lake Elmo Inn, a municipal retail on-sale liquor license holder, to dispense beer and wine coolers off premises and allow for consumption within the parameters set for the City's Volksmarch event being held October 11, 2014."

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

Pursuant to MN State Statute 340A.404 Subd. 4(b), under Special provisions; sports, conventions, or cultural facilities; community festivals, the governing body of a municipality may authorize a holder of a retail on-sale intoxicating liquor license issued by the municipality to dispense intoxicating liquor off premises at a community festival held within the municipality. The authorization shall specify the area in which the intoxicating liquor must be dispensed and consumed, and shall not be issued unless the licensee demonstrates that it has liability insurance as prescribed by Section 340A.409 to cover the event. The City of Lake Elmo, in conjunction with local businesses and the community, will hold the Lake Elmo Volksmarch event on October 11, 2014. Authorization is necessary for the safe sale of alcohol at the event and to confirm that requirement of liability insurance for the municipal on-sale license holder.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council authorize, as part of its Consent Agenda, for John Schiltz, owner and operator of Lake Elmo Inn, a municipal retail on-sale liquor license holder, to dispense beer and wine coolers off premises and allow for consumption within the parameters set for the City's Volksmarch event being held October 11, 2014. As part of the consent agenda, no formal motion is required. <u>POLICY RECCOMENDER:</u> Mayor Mike Pearson & Council Member Mike Reeves, Members of the Policy Advisory Committee of the Gateway Commission

FISCAL IMPACT: Up to \$40,000 in planning support for Transportation Oriented Development from Washington County and \$30,000-\$50,000 in economic development analysis for the Bus Rapid Transit route along Hudson Boulevard.

SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUESTED: The City of Lake Elmo Council is asked to adopt Resolution No. 2014-71 recommending the evaluation of a bus rapid transit corridor that may be located in the right of way of Hudson Boulevard from Inwood Avenue to possibly as far as Manning Avenue. This alignment is known as the (A-B-C-D2 (Lake Elmo) – E2) cordior that runs from St. Paul to Lake Elmo / Woodbury.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY: For 5+ plus years the Gateway Commission has explored mass transit strategies meant to create better efficiencies in moving commuter back and forth from St. Paul to the east end of Washington County. For the most part, the study has concentrated on a

east-west transit line through the City of Woodbury (D1) with Lake Elmo resident access to the system being the Guardian Angels Church Park N Ride. Earlier this year, due to traffic management difficulties and ingress-egress conflicts, the Woodbury corridor was deferred to the Lake Elmo side of I-94 due to the green field nature of the community, less congestion, and a better opportunity to work with landowners on ingress-egress issues. So Lake Elmo went from an interested bystander in the Gateway process to a catalyst in the ability to extend the transit route past Oakdale. Earlier this year, the Gateway Commission chose bus rapid transit over light rail as the mode of transportation for costs savings, construction efficiency, and practicality.

In the process of reviewing the impact of bus rapid transit in Lake Elmo, the City conducted meetings with landowners, its economic development authority, County/Met Council/ state officials, and other communities as part of its due diligence. On September 9, 2104 the City conducted a workshop with members of the Washington County Board to determine items of concern or need to approve the local Preferred Alternative needed to advance the project to the next level. Each City must adopt an LPA resolution prior to October 7, 2014 for the gateway project to be included in the Met Council's Transportation Project Plan. Adoption in to this plan will allow for the access of federal planning dollars to continue the analysis.

In this due diligence, the City has come to the conclusion that (5) major items need to be addressed between the approval of the LPA resolution and the City's final approval – called municipal consent – that would be the final binding approval before transit route construction can take place. These items are:

- 1. That the County assumed jurisdictional control of Hudson Boulevard from Inwood Avenue to Manning Avenue which would could save Lake Elmo \$10 million to \$15 million over a 20 year period.
- 2. That Lake Elmo and the County agree to an access plan for Hudson Boulevard that would maintain current ingress-egress access for landowners to avoid business disruption.
- 3. The Gateway Commission consider an easterly station in the proximity of the NW corner of Manning Avenue and I-94 to support economic development.
- 4. That due to infrastructure constraints, an interchange is never built at the crossroads of I-94 and Lake Elmo Avenue.
- 5. That a safety and security plan be developed for the Gateway Corridor that insures Lake Elmo residents will not be adversely affect by the BRT.

These concerns were incorporated into the attached resolution and have been communicated to both the Gateway Commission and Washington County technical staff.

Failure to pass this LPA would force the Gateway Commission into a 180 day proving process for the need of the BRT with the Met Council and eliminate federal funding for future analysis.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION (SWOT):

Strengths Passage of the LPA will allow the City to access planning dollars

and support PLUS an independent economic development study (funded by East Metro Strong) to help in the commercial development of Lake Elmo. The value of this service is \$70,000-\$90,000 of program revenue. Lake Elmo can still veto the

process at municipal consent.

Weaknesses Lake Elmo has not had the sufficient time to fully analyze the

ramifications of Gateway and the E2 terminus without regard to a station on Manning Ave. could hamstring development efforts.

Opportunities A complete economic development analysis would help in the

recruitment of business and proper planning of the I94 corridor.

Threats BRT could cause traffic congestion, increased density and other

safety issues that could affect the community's character.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Based on the aforementioned, the staff recommends and appropriate guiding motion.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-71

A RESOLUTION TRANSMITTING THE CITY OF LAKE ELMO'S SUPPORT OF THE LOCALLY PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE (LPA) TO THE RCRRA, WCRRA, and METROPOLITAN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor is a proposed project that will provide for transit infrastructure improvements in the eastern portion of the Twin Cities, and;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the project is to provide transit service to meet the existing and long-term regional mobility and local accessibility needs for businesses and the traveling public within the project area by providing all day bi-directional station-to-station service that compliments existing and planned express bus service in the corridor, and;

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor is located in Ramsey and Washington Counties, Minnesota, extending approximately 12 miles, and connecting downtown Saint Paul with its East Side neighborhoods and the suburbs of Maplewood, Landfall, Oakdale, Lake Elmo, and Woodbury, and;

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor Commission (GCC), in partnership with the Metropolitan Council and other project stakeholders, completed the Gateway Corridor Alternatives Analysis (AA) Study that in addition to the No-Build alternative recommended one bus rapid transit (BRT) and one light trail transit (LRT) alternative be advanced for further study in the federal and state environmental review process, and;

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA); the Washington County Regional Railroad Authority (WCRRA), serving on behalf of the GCC; and the Metropolitan Council have initiated the environmental review process for the Gateway Corridor project, with FTA designated as the lead federal agency for this project, and;

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor project recently received the important Presidential designation as a Federal Infrastructure Permitting Dashboard Project, and;

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor project recently completed the Scoping phase of the environmental process, which resulted with the Policy Advisory Committee (PAC) and the GCC recommending further study of the No-Build alternative, four BRT alternatives operating within a dedicated Guideway (A-B-C-D1-E1, A-B-C-D2-E1, A-B-C-D2-E3) and a managed lane alternative in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) at the request of the FTA and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and;

WHEREAS, the BRT alignments that advance into the Draft EIS will be further defined and evaluated to minimize impacts to surrounding properties and the I-94 corridor which may include operating in existing lanes with mixed traffic at pinch points where right-of-way is constrained, enhance economic development potential, and reduce capital costs while providing required operating efficiency, with attention to mobility options for environmental justice populations, and;

WHEREAS, through the Scoping process, the PAC and the GCC recommended that the LRT alternative be eliminated from further study due to its higher costs while generating a similar ridership, and;

WHEREAS, the identification of a Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) is a critical first step in pursuing federal funding for the Gateway Corridor project, and;

WHEREAS, the adoption of the LPA into the Metropolitan Council's Transportation Policy Plan will conclude the FTA Alternatives Analysis process, and;

WHEREAS, the LPA will be one of the Build alternatives identified and studied in the Draft EIS, and;

WHEREAS, the LPA includes the definition of the Gateway Corridor mode and a conceptual alignment which can be refined through further engineering efforts, and;

WHEREAS, the LPA selection process does not replace or override the requirement to fully examine alternatives and determine the adverse impacts that must be avoided or mitigated under the federal and state environmental review process, and;

WHEREAS, the comments submitted by agencies, the business sector, and the public during the Scoping phase, as well as the additional comments received from adjacent communities since the Scoping phase, will be addressed accordingly through the Draft EIS process, and;

WHEREAS, the PAC and GCC each passed resolutions on July 24, 2014 recommending BRT Alternative A-B-C-D2-E2 (*see attached figure*) as the proposed LPA for review at the August 7 PAC sponsored LPA public hearing and inclusion in the Metropolitan Council's Draft 2040 Transportation Policy Plan, and;

WHEREAS, the Gateway Corridor PAC/GCC held a public hearing on August 7, 2014 as part of the LPA decision making process. A total of 35 comments were received through the proposed LPA review process, and;

WHEREAS, the Cities will be working collaboratively and with support from the GCC to complete a market analysis and station area plans for the areas around the BRT Guideway stations as a part of the Draft EIS process, and;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Lake Elmo supports the LPA recommendation of the PAC and GCC and identifies the dedicated BRT alternative generally on the Hudson Road – Hudson Boulevard alignment that crosses to the south side of I-94 between approximately Lake Elmo Avenue and Manning Avenue is the Locally Preferred Alternative for the Gateway Corridor project (see attached figure).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Lake Elmo commits to undertaking and developing station area plans with the support of the GCC for the proposed BRT guideway station areas within its jurisdiction based on the results of a market analysis, community input, and Metropolitan Council guidelines and expectations for development density, level of activity, and design.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that through the Draft EIS process the PAC and the GCC will continue to evaluate and focus on transit service connections to the dedicated BRT system (A-B-C-D2-E2), including an efficient feeder bus network, as well as the number and location of stations throughout the Gateway Corridor to maximize service, accessibility, and surrounding economic development opportunities, while minimizing impacts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Lake Elmo commits to working with the Washington County Regional Railroad Authority, on behalf of the Gateway Corridor Commission, and the Metropolitan Council to address the comments submitted by agencies, adjacent communities, the business sector, and the public during the Scoping phase, as well as additional comments received during the development of the LPA, through the Draft EIS process, and the following areas of particular importance to the City of Lake Elmo.

- 1. The ownership and maintenance responsibilities of Hudson Boulevard were recently turned back to the City of Lake Elmo from MnDOT. If Hudson Boulevard is expanded to accommodate a BRT guideway or additional travel lanes for the exclusive use of buses it may increase the demands on the City to properly maintain the roadway. The City of Lake Elmo requests analysis of appropriate jurisdictional control over Hudson Boulevard and robust consideration of a possible turn back to Washington County.
- 2. Maintaining access for current land owners along Hudson Boulevard and planning for access for future development needs to be part of a functional ingress egress policy. The City of Lake Elmo requests the development of an access management plan for Hudson Blvd. that is supported by property owners, the City of Lake Elmo and Washington County.
- 3. The City of Lake Elmo supports an easterly station in the proximity of the NW corner of Manning Avenue and I-94 to support economic development, including job creation, tax value, and traffic efficiency

associated with the creation of a business park as guided by the City's Comprehensive Plan. Incorporating a Gateway station in Lake Elmo will require station area planning resources to ensure that Lake Elmo is maximizing economic development potential and ridership. The City Lake Elmo requests thorough analysis of economic development potential to assist in guiding the placement of Gateway stations in the corridor segment from Keats Avenue to Manning Avenue as well as planning resources from the Gateway Corridor Commission and Washington County to assist with transit oriented development/station area planning.

- 4. Lake Elmo Avenue serves as an important access point to downtown Lake Elmo. Due to the proximity of the road to both the Lake and developed neighborhoods, future expansion is constrained through the downtown area and the roadway cannot functionally handle additional growth in the regional movement of traffic beyond what is currently forecasted. The City of Lake Elmo recognizes that while the Gateway Corridor project will likely not preclude an interchange in this location, it would like to take this opportunity to state to Washington County, the Minnesota Department of Transportation and the Federal Highways Administration that an interchange is NOT desired in this location.
- 5. Safety and security at BRT stations for transit patrons and surrounding businesses and neighborhoods is very important to Lake Elmo. BRT Stations should be designed to be safe and secure environments that incorporate design elements to deter crime such as good lighting, visibility, security monitoring. The City of Lake Elmo requests a safety and security plan to ensure that adequate resources are provided at a regional and local level to effectively address safety and security concerns at Gateway Corridor facilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution adopted by the City of Lake Elmo be forwarded to the Metropolitan Council for their consideration.
