ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

City Council is asked to review and accept, as part of Consent Agenda, a brief description of activities that have taken place in the Public Works Department in the month of June 2021.

PROPOSAL DETAILS/ANALYSIS:

STREETS

- Continue pot hole repair
- The Heritage, Old Village and Hamlet street/utility projects continue
- The city radar trailer has been moved around the city this month to include 50th St, Hudson Blvd, Lake Elmo Ave near the lake & Lake Jane Trail
- Add gravel to upper 33rd St
- Mow ditches for safety/visibility
- Took delivery of roughly 1000 yards of free gravel/millings

WATER

- Complete monthly MDH bacteria, fluoride, Lead/copper sampling and submit well water draw down reports
- Water usage exceeded our pumping capacity in June which required implementing an emergency watering ban. Public Works has continued modifying its water supply system and enforcing the restrictions to help reduce the demand
- Well 5 is online and pumping daily, punch list items are being completed
- Submit Updated Risk and Resilience Plan
- Complete Quarterly Meter Reading

SEWER

• The Royal South Generator experienced major engine failure in June. The developers warranty was still in place and is being investigated

SURFACE WATER

- Clean out plugged storm drains
- Replaced a section of failed storm sewer in Sanctuary
- Submit Annual MS4 report

PARKS

- GIS intern Sophia Jensen has completed the interactive park and trail map found on the city web site
- Installed court rules signs at Ivywood, Lions, Tablyn and Pebble Park Courts

SAFETY COMMITTIEE

• Completed quarterly safety inspections of Fire Department. Review all department safety concerns and any incident/accidents
