Review month end activity update from fire department.

PROPOSAL DETAILS/ANALYSIS:

We had 46 calls in July.

- 9 Dispatched and Cancelled En Route
- 2 Motor Vehicle Accident w/ Injuries
- 2 Motor Vehicle Fire
- 1 Agricultural Vegetation Fire
- 1 Heavy Equipment Fire
- 1 Fire Alarm
- Sprinkler System Activation No Fire
- 1 False Call / Dispatch Error
- 1 Odor of Smoke
- 1 Vehicle Overheat No Fire

Incidents through July 2021: 301 (2020 YTD: 329)

Our average response time was 9.2 minutes from alarm to arrival. 23 calls had 3 or less responders minus the Duty Officer with 6 calls having only 1 personnel on the first due apparatus. The Duty Officer was the only responder 3 times this month.

- Vehicle and equipment inspections.

- Organizing and prepping all excess equipment for sale or disposal.
