CITY OF LAKE ELMO COMBINED CITY HALL & PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITY

The new Lake Elmo City Hall / Public Safety Facility combines City Hall staff and functions, the entire Fire Department, and a satellite office for the Washington County Sheriff's department. This co-location involves renovating and expanding the City-owned Brookfield Office building to concentrate civic resources into a single structure at the historic core of the city. In addition, the Public Works facility will also be expanded to accommodate City growth and expanded service needs.



TOTAL ANTICIPATED PROJECT COST: \$14,600,000 DESIGN COMPLETION: Late summer 2021 CONSTRUCTION COMPLETION: Fall of 2022

Spring has sprung!

Advice for eco-friendly landscaping, native gardens, & shoreline buffers

□"Leaf" some for the bees

In the early days of spring, many pollinators and beneficial insects are still in hibernation. Wait until the daytime temps are consistently above 50°F to cut down stems and rake leaves out of garden beds.

□Wait to rake or fertilize your lawn

In the early spring, most lawns are still soft. Raking injures the grass and creates bare patches for weeds to grow. Fertilizing too early encourages the grass to grow tall instead of building healthy roots.

□Don't trim oak branches or dig near oaks

April, May and June are high risk months for oak wilt, a fungal disease that kills thousands of oak trees every year.

☐ Plan a native garden

Native plants provide food and habitat for birds and pollinators and don't need irrigation, fertilizer, or lawn chemicals.

Use the "Plant Finder" tool at www.BlueThumb.org to learn which native plants are best suited for your yard - whether it is sunny or shady, wet or dry. The website also has links to native plant retailers.



SUMMARY OF AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO COMCAST OF MINNESOTA, INC. ("COMCAST") TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE, AND MAINTAIN A CABLE SYSTEM IN THE CITY OF LAKE ELMO, MINNESOTA SETTING FORTH CONDITIONS ACCOMPANYING THE GRANT OF THE FRANCHISE; PROVIDING FOR REGULATION AND USE OF THE SYSTEM AND THE PUBLIC RIGHTS- OFWAY; AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS HEREIN.

On April 6, 2021, the City of Lake Elmo, Minnesota ("City") will consider adoption of an Ordinance granting a Cable Television Franchise to Comcast. The Ordinance serves two purposes. First, it grants a nonexclusive cable franchise to Comcast to operate and maintain a cable system within the City. Second, it provides requirements for the provision of cable television services including technical standards, customer service obligations, and related matters.

The Ordinance includes the following key terms:

- 1) Establishes a franchise term of ten (10) years;
- Imposes on Comcast a franchise fee of five percent (5%) of Comcast's annual gross revenues;
- 3) Incorporates the City Code regarding right-of-way protections;
- Requires Comcast to dedicate channel capacity for public, education, and government ("PEG") programming;
- Establishes a PEG Fee between three-and-one-quarter percent (3.25%) and twoand-three-quarters percent (2.75%) of Comcast's annual gross revenues;
- Imposes strong customer-service standards regarding Comcast's provision of cable services; and
- Requires a performance bond and letter of credit to enforce Comcast's compliance with the Ordinance.

It is hereby determined that publication of this title and summary will clearly inform the public of the intent and effect of the Ordinance. A copy of the entire Ordinance shall be posted at the Lake Elmo City Hall.

If you are planning on being away from home or on vacation please follow some of the tips bellow to increase the safety and security of your property.

- 1. Lock all of the doors and windows.
- Clear out the mailbox and notify the post office to hold your mail until you return. If you are having packages delivered be sure to use the package tracking options and arrange for the package to be picked up by a friend of family member.
- Keep the yard and/or driveway maintained. Removal of snow from the driveway and walking paths is important.
- Hide or secure your valuables from view of windows. Using safes is helpful in securing important items.
- Don't broadcast your plans of being gone on social media. Only notify those who will be helping you in keeping an eye on your residence like a neighbor, family or friends.
- Get your security system updated, tested and notified of your vacancy. Posting security signage in your yard on residence can help with deterrence of theft and burglary. Many door camera systems can be purchased at a reasonable price with instant notification of activity at your residence while you are away.
- Adjust your heating settings especially as temperatures can drop significantly this time of year to avoid frozen water lines.
- Security lighting and timers. The proper lighting on your residence can help to deter theft.
- 9. Request vacation checks through the Sheriff's Office while you are out of town.
