## **Absentee Voting Reminders:**

Voters are encouraged to submit absentee ballot applications early.

The earliest a ballot will be mailed to you is 46 days prior to Election Day for all elections except Township elections.

Allow enough time to complete the application, have your ballot mailed to you, vote your ballot, and return it to Washington County via mail so it is received by Election Day. You cannot drop off your voted ballot at your precinct on Election Day. To request a paper application be mailed to you, call Washington County Elections at 651-430-6790.

### Manning Ave./30th St. Project Detour



The County Highway 15 (Manning Avenue) and 30th St Intersection Improvements project in the City of Lake Elmo will begin Tuesday, September 6th. 30th St will be closed west of County Highway 15 (Manning Avenue) starting Tuesday, September 6th and the closure is expected to run through October. Please follow the posted detour route. Project updates will be available on the Washington County project page: Manning Ave/30th St.



## County Highway 13/Ideal Avenue Construction Update

The County Highway 13 (Ideal Ave) reconstruction project between County Hwy 14 (34<sup>th</sup> St) and 44<sup>th</sup> St is well underway. The project will enter the final construction stage on Sept 16. At this time, Ideal Ave will reopen between 39<sup>th</sup> St and Hidden Bay Trail while closing between Hidden Bay Trail and 44<sup>th</sup> St. The final (stage) closure is expected to run to mid-October.

During the (Hidden Bay to 44<sup>th</sup> St) closure, access to Hidden Bay will be maintained, but will be available from the south. Likewise, access will be maintained to 44<sup>th</sup> St from the north.

Resident access between Hidden Bay and 44<sup>th</sup> St will be from the north, but may be from the south at times depending on work in the area.

# **Upcoming**

Information about upcoming traffic impacts will be provided as details become available. Motorists can expect off-peak, night time single lane closures from I-35E to Greeley St. Motorists can also expect flagging under traffic on the frontage road from I-694 to Manning Ave.

• 60th St. is reduced to one lane between Hilton Trail and Manning Ave. A flagger will be present to direct traffic.


Sat, Sept. 10 from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m.

• Watch for periodic lane closures on Hwy 36 between Edgerton St. and Greeley

MnDOT urges motorists to always be attentive, drive with caution, slow down in work zones where workers are present. Please follow the posted detour route and avoid traveling through residential neighborhoods for the safety of those that live in the area.

# **Watering Restrictions**

Reminder: City ordinance allows for outdoor watering between the hours of **6PM and 5AM and follows an odd/even schedule**. Properties with even-numbered postal addresses may water, sprinkle, or irrigate their lawns only on even-numbered days. Properties with odd-numbers postal addresses may water only on odd-numbered days.

To help reduce water usage, and your water bill, the City of Lake Elmo is

contributing up to \$200 of the cost of smart irrigation controller devices. These smart controller devices can help save a household as much as 10,000 gallons of water per year!

# Drain your swimming pool safely!

Discharging chlorinated pool or hot tub water into the street or a lake, stream, or wetland can kill fish and aquatic life!



Stop adding chlorine and leave the water exposed to the air for 3-5 days to naturally break down the chlorine.



Once the water is de-chlorinated, you can safely drain it to your yard.

# CITY OF LAKE ELMO COMBINED CITY HALL & PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITY

The new Lake Elmo City Hall / Public Safety Facility combines City Hall staff and functions, the entire Fire Department, and a satellite office for the Washington County Sheriff's department. This co-location involves renovating and expanding the City-owned Brookfield Office building to concentrate civic resources into a single structure at the historic core of the city. In addition, the Public Works facility will also be expanded to accommodate City growth and expanded service needs.



TOTAL ANTICIPATED PROJECT COST: \$14,600,000
DESIGN COMPLETION: Late summer 2021
CONSTRUCTION COMPLETION: Fall of 2022
