



ADOPT A STORM DRAIN PROGRAM

Pumpkin Drop-off Sites in Washington County

When Halloween is over, don't trash your pumpkins! Instead, bring them to a drop-off site in Washington County. Drop-off sites will be open to all residents from October 31 - November 12 in seven locations: Cottage Grove, Hugo, Mahtomedi, Oakdale, Scandia, Stillwater, and Woodbury. Pumpkins must be free of paint, glitter, or any other decorations.


