park. Nearly 30 acres of new park land was acquired by the city in connection with the Legacy development. The park will contain nature walking trails throughout the area. Fertilization 1x per year around labor day. Sweep up any grass clippings or fertilizer that fall on streets and sidewalks to keep and out of the street deals.

## PMOW Less



Lawn doesn't need to be mown as often during dry spells.

### MOW HIGH - AT LEAST 3"

Taller grass has deeper roots, needs less water, and is more resistant to weeds.



# THE WEEDS

DANDELIONS, CLOVER AND CREEPING CHARLIE PROVIDE EARLY SEASON NECTAR FOR BEES AND POLLINATORS

Historically, lawns have had a mix of species, including clover and creeping thyme.

If you use herbicide, spot treat only instead of spraying your whole lawn.


### **IRRIGATION REMINDERS**


During irrigation season, please remember the city ordinance allows properties connected to the city water system to irrigate 2 days per week (according to the city irrigation zone map). Irrigation is restricted from the hours of 5am-5pm. Hand watering is allowed at any time and new sod waivers are available if needed.

There has been a recent uptick in pop up attachments on our Facebook page for folks to register on line and make payments on-line.





### **Traffic impacts**

I-94 Oakdale to Lakeland project area map: <u>View full-size map</u> All traffic impacts are tentative and weather-dependent.

#### **Current**

#### Lane closures

Through Sat, Sept. 14

- WB I-94 is reduced to two lanes between Woodbury Dr. and Century Ave.
- EB I-94 is reduced to three lanes between Century Ave. and Woodbury Dr.
  - Traffic going east past the Woodbury Dr./Keats Ave. N. exit should use the left two lanes
  - Traffic exiting onto I-494, I-694, Radio Dr./Inwood Ave. N. or Woodbury Dr./Keats Ave. N. should use the right lane

### Ramp closures

Through October

- The ramp from Tamarack Rd. to SB I-494 is closed
  - Detour: <u>Tamarack Rd., Weir Dr., Valley Creek Rd. and SB I-494 (PNG)</u>
- The ramp from NB I-494 to Tamarack Rd. is closed
  - Detour: Valley Creek Rd., Bielenberg Dr. and Tamarack Rd. (PNG)
- The ramp from 10th St. N. to NB I-694 is closed
  - Detour: 10th St. N., Inwood Ave. N., Stillwater Blvd., Ideal Ave. N., 34th St. N. and NB I-694 (PNG)



When water from rain, snow, or sleet flows over the ground, it's called "stormwater." Stormwater can pick up debris, litter, fertilizer, and pesticides used for lawn care. And when that stormwater flows into street gutters, storm drains, and downstream, it can pollute rivers, lakes, and streams. Follow these simple pollution solutions to help keep local waterways clean and healthy!



DON'T MOW TOO LOW

Only remove 1/3 of the grass blade height and leave clippings on lawn to allow nutrients to return to the soil—they act as a natural fertilizer!



CHEMICALS

Read the label when applying pesticides CAREFUL WITH and fertilizers, use them sparingly, and avoid applying them to pavement. When there is rain in the forecast, any chemicals you apply can wash downstream.



ONLY RAIN IN THE DRAIN

Don't rake, sweep, or hose debris down the storm drains. Leaves, yard clippings, and trash can clog storm pipes, causing floods and polluted waterways.



CURB YOUR WATER WASTE

Direct sprinklers toward the lawn and away from pavement to save water and keep chemicals and debris out of storm drains. Check out www.epa.gov/watersense for more tips to save water!
