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

Scope of Improvements

- O1 Street and Drainage Improvements to public streets in 5 neighborhoods consistent with the City's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and Pavement Management Plan.
- Geotechnical investigation supports reclamation of the existing roadway to improve the streets
- 03 No street widening or street geometric changes are being proposed
- 04 Replace existing asphalt curb with new barrier concrete curb and gutter
- 05 Inspect and repair existing storm sewer including review of extensions as recommended by the engineer



Assessment Information

- City funds 70% total project costs
- Streets assessed 30% total project costs

Proposed Parking Restrictions

- 01 Restrict parking on all cul-de-sacs and turn around areas.
- Restrict parking to one side only along roads 24-feet wide which includes 59th Street Court, 55th Street, and Julep Way.
- o3 Install no parking signs per policy.



Neighborhood Meetings

- O1 Separate meetings were held for each neighborhood to review improvements and assessments specific to each
- **02** People were generally appreciative of the information and opportunity to ask questions
- Most common questions and issues were related to the construction schedule, access, and property specific items such as irrigation systems
- **04** Some questions and concerns related to the new parking restrictions were noted



Bids Received & Project Costs

- The City received 7 competitive public bids on April 22, 2025.
- Valley Paving, Inc. provided the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$1,485,436.50.
- Total estimated project costs are estimated to be \$2,098,000 versus the number presented in the feasibility report of \$2,609,000.
- Assessments will be recalculated once the project is complete and prior to the final assessment hearing planned to be held in fall 2025.



Findings and Recommendations

- It is recommended to improve the public street and drainage systems in the 5 neighborhoods identified as recommended in the feasibility reports and project plans and specifications.
- It is recommended that the improvements be assessed to each property in accordance with City policy reflected by the preliminary assessment rolls provided in the feasibility reports.
- It is recommended that street and storm sewer assessments be payable over 15 years and charged an interest rate of 1% over the bond rate for the project.
- The project, as proposed, is technically and financially feasible, is necessary, cost-effective, and will result in benefit to the properties to be assessed.

Requested Council Action

• The City Council is respectfully requested to conduct a Public Improvement Hearing for the 2025 Street Improvements project.

Following the hearing:

- Council is asked to consider approving a resolution ordering the improvements, accepting bids, and awarding a contract to Valley Paving, Inc. for the bid amount of \$1,485,436.50 for the 2025 Street Improvements.
- Staff is also recommending that the City Council authorize the City Administrator to enter into a material testing contract for the project in the not-to-exceed amount of \$30,000.
