Dear Mr. Smith:

In your letter of February 19, you point out the problems of sewage disposal in connection with the proposed Guardian Angels school in East Oakdale township. We have been told that there will be a special type drain field installed for this school which has been approved by your department.

In complete agreement with the thoughts of your letter, our Town Board, Planning committee, and residents of East Oakdale believe that sewage disposal is the major problem we face in the long range development of our area. For this reason we have employed the firm of Bonestroo, Rosene & Associates to make a preliminary survey of our Township so that they can tell us what our ultimate sewerage system will look like. Our township is in such an early stage of development that we do not expect to install any sewer mains immediately, but a knowledge of where they will ultimately be and what the problems will be should have a profound effect on our planning and development.

As regards the Guardian Angels school, there is a possibility, based on topographical considerations, of some day having a sewer main from the center of our Township south through Woodbury and Cottage Grove Townships and thence to the Mississippi. Woodbury has talked about this, and we want to be in a position to cooperate if and when they take any action.

If you have any further thoughts on this matter we would certainly like to hear of them.
