

Meeting of the East Oakdale Planning Commission  
September 20, 1967

Present: Beske, Eberhardt, Klohn, Kleis, Leslie, Lundquist,  
Morgan and Schiltgen

Leo McGough, a contractor, appeared and requested a permit to build a caretakers home on the Carmelite property. The proposed dimensions, 24 X 32, makes the proposed home smaller than our Ordinances allow. It was moved by Leslie, seconded by Morgan, that we recommend permitting a building permit under a variance for the following reasons:

the house would be completely secluded

the land will probably never be sold - it would destroy the Carmelite  
privacy

the house will be used for a maximum of a married couple only

In regard to the study made of the Oakdale incorporation, it was moved that we recommend to the Town Board to favor Plan 1 of the MPC, and proceed to consolidate with Lake Elmo. Seconded and carried.

In regard to the letter of the Park and Recreation Committee of 9-9-67 regarding the proposed park on Lake Jane, it was moved by Leslie and seconded by Beske that we recommend that consideration be given to the park acquisition and that park development work be postponed. Carried.

In regard to the trailer request on Tony Dierks farm for people who would take care of Tony, it was moved by Beske, seconded by Schiltgen, that we recommend giving a special use permit on a yearly basis because of the general benefit that would accrue to the community if Tony were cared for. Carried.

The next meeting will be on October 11 unless there is reason for one earlier.
