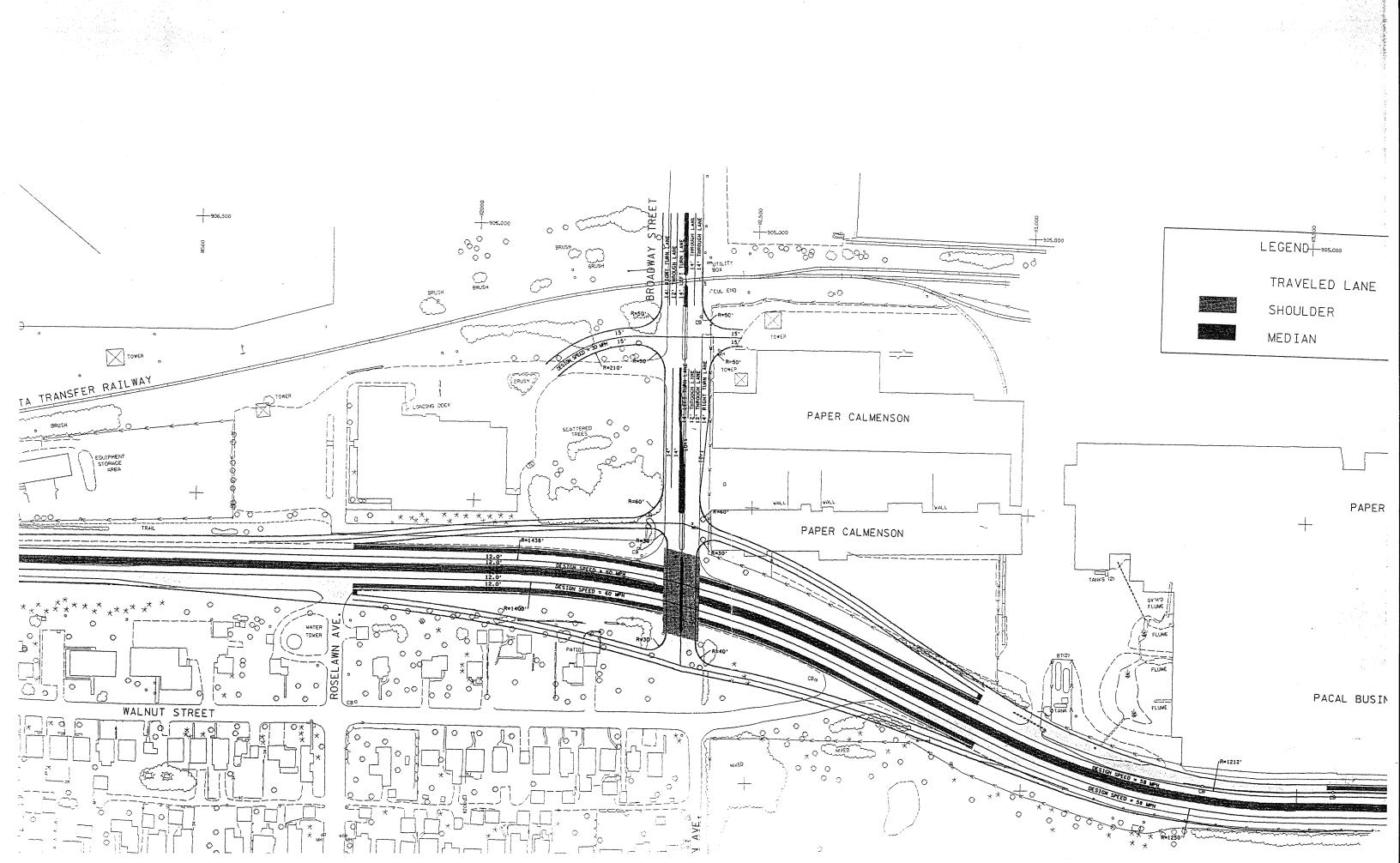

Lauderdale City Council Meeting Minutes June 12, 2001

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

- 7. SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS/RECOGNITIONS/PROCLAMATIONS/ CITIZEN'S ADDRESSSING THE STREET AND UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS
 - A. Recognition of Intern Kevin Walsh. City Administrator Rick Getschow stated that Kevin Walsh's last day with the City would be Wednesday June 13th. Getschow stated that Kevin did an excellent job and was a valuable asset to the City in his time here. Shannon Goyette, Deputy Clerk, has returned from her leave of absence as of Monday, June 11th, thus ending Kevin's internship.

8. INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATIONS

A. Metro Transit Presentation- Adam Harrington, Manager of Route and System Planning. Harrington briefed the City Council on the restructuring of the bus routes in the metropolitan area. The driving issue behind the restructuring is productivity versus coverage. The Met Transit had the goal of increasing productivity (put more buses where more people are) at the expense of coverage (having stops in all areas of the community). They wanted to accomplish this while still attempting to minimize coverage losses by keeping 99% of all riders in the system (defined as those within ¼ mile of a bus stop).

The Mayor and some members of the City Council expressed appreciation for the presentation, but felt that this restructuring for increased productivity purposes can have negative effects on long-term riders. It is understandable to design a more efficient system with an updated grid design that can attract more riders, but the decrease in service (more transfers, longer walks to stops) to current riders may not be worth the changes.

Harrington stated that Met Transit is constantly evaluating the route system, and he could return next spring for an update on the effect of the restructuring.

B. 2001 Street and Utility Improvements. The City Engineer updated the City Council on the current status of the project. The first phase (Carl, Roselawn to Spring) of the construction project is at the street work stage. The second phase (Carl, Spring to Larpenteur) of the project should begin in late June.

The Engineer also addressed the corrections to be undertaken by the contractor from the 2000 Project, especially as it relates to remediation work in the Community Park.

10. ACTION

A. 1862 Eustis Street-Boulevard (Right-of-Way) Trees. The City Administrator provided background on the April 24th City Council meeting, when the resident's of 1862 Eustis Street addressed the City Council regarding the elm trees scheduled to be removed from the right-of-way in front of their house as a result of the 2001 Street and Utility Improvements. The resident's requested a change in the scope of the project (i.e., changing the nature of the curb and gutter construction) to facilitate the trees remaining in place. The Council at that time expressed no willingness to change the scope of the project for this purpose, but did ask that city representatives continue to meet with the residents at site regarding the proposed tree removals.

That meeting occurred on site on May 10th when the issue of the owner assuming all liability and cost associated with all outcomes of the trees remaining in their current location was discussed. This includes the owner being responsible for tree removal at a later date for any reason, since it is the desire of the City to remove the trees at this time. The owner felt that the elm trees could survive the planned improvements at the location. The owner also sent a letter to the Council stating the desire to assume liability for the trees.

The Council discussed this liability issue and the drafting and execution of an agreement that the City Council would later approve. The Council asked the Administrator to gather more information (i.e., liability for future possible damage to the Street and Utility Improvements caused by the trees) from The City Attorney regarding the proposed agreement before they would consider further action. This item will be placed on the June 19, 2001 Council agenda for further consideration.

Background:

MNDOT representatives will once again attending the meeting to provide a preliminary design to the City Council on the 280 Reconstruction project.

It is the intent of the MNDOT representatives to address the concerns that the City Council raised regarding this project at the March 13th City Council meeting.

Residents directly affected by the proposed project on Walnut Street have been informed about the meeting, and will most likely be in attendance.

 - A. State Senator John Marty and State Representative Mary Jo McGuire. Senator Marty and Representative McGuire discussed with the City Council legislative issues that are of concern to the City including: property tax reform, tax increment financing reform, local government sales tax repeal, county turnbacks, MSA funding, unfunded mandates, and the current PERA shortfall. They also discussed other bills that they have authored or co-authored this current session.

A break was taken at 8:40 p.m. The meeting resumed at 8:50 p.m.

B. Highway 280 Reconstruction Update – Minnesota Department of Transportation. Nancy Daubenberger, Highway 280 Project Manager; Frank Pafko, MNDOT Area Manager; and Pete Wasco, Environmental Specialist, updated the City Council on the current status of the Highway 280 reconstruction project.

Federal funds were obtained in 2000 to reconstruct the portion of #280 between Larpenteur Avenue and Highway 36/35W. The current plan is to undertake this work in 2003 or 2004. The rest of the #280 reconstruction work, including the Como and Larpenteur interchanges, is not specifically scheduled and would not begin until at least 2010. The MNDOT representatives discussed the layout of the portion of the highway that was planned for 2003-2004 reconstruction. The removal of the stoplights at Broadway and County Road B2, along with the construction of an interchange at Broadway, was discussed.

The City Council expressed disappointment with the plan to only complete only a portion of #280 in Lauderdale. There would be a number of safety and logistical problems that would be a part of removing stoplights, not reconstructing the Larpenteur interchange, and not addressing the single lane ramp on to Highway 36. They also expressed concern for the disruption to any city properties as it relates to the construction of the Broadway interchange.

MNDOT representatives appreciated the feedback and would return to the City Council at a later date when further planning and design has been completed.

Background:

Here is a quick update on this issue since the Tuesday Council meeting:

- Due to the weather conditions, the rest of the trees in the project were not removed. This means that tabling this item for the June 12th to June 19th may have no effect on two potential mobilizations.
- I am still waiting for the City Attorney to respond to the inquiry regarding the owner assuming liability for damage to the street and curb from the trees staying in place. I anticipate having that information on Tuesday.
- I have updated the owner of the property on the above issue. He states that it appears to him that only one elm tree (of three total trees) could ever affect the curb and street. He stated that he might be willing to allow that one tree to be removed if tat is the case.

Council Action Requested:

Provide direction on whether to pursue a liability agreement with the owners of 1862 Eustis Street regarding the three boulevard trees adjacent to the property.
