Mark Chapin came highly recommended as a speaker by Roseville's Sustainability Coordinator. Mark is recently retired from Hennepin County where he was the County Auditor and Treasurer. He has been involved with many other community groups including the Creative Enterprise Zone (CEZ). Mark lead their 100 Trees Initiative.					
Per CEZ's website: CEZ's 100 Trees Initiative is a grassroots effort to grow and plant street trees to expand the urban tree canopy and reduce the heat island effect in Saint Paul's Creative Enterprise Zone (South Saint Anthony Park.) Since 2021, the 100 Trees Initiative has Planted 400 new street trees on public boulevards in the Zone. Grown bare root trees in gravel beds for replanting. Purchased a 600-gallon mobile watering trailer. Piloted a weekly district-wide tree watering program with the help of volunteers and AmeriCorps members.					
 Implemented a tree health monitoring program. Launched the CEZ Tree Guild, a monthly meet-up for tree lovers. Has been showcased in a Star Tribune newspaper article on grassroots tree projects in the Twin Cities.

DESCRIPTION OF					
Ann has been looking at concepts for the bee garden at City Hall (black area marked on the map). During the meeting, we can go outside and look at the space she proposes near the front door. Once the Commission agrees on the concept, staff can bring it to the council for approval. We are trying to figure out processes but that seems to make sense because staff can include the anticipated costs. The Council also wants to be able to highlight what the Commission is working on.					
The one question staff had about putting the bee garden near the front door is whether that will generate complaints from people who are allergic to or afraid of bees. Part of the project is to demonstrate that native bees and honey bees are generally docile, but there are other pollinators that are less docile like yellow jackets and hornets. Staff put that forward for discussion because we have no expertise in this area.
