

Gregory Goodwine is the Climate Health Educator working with cities on the project. He will be at the meeting to continue discussing the grant and the process to develop a plan that meets the objectives of the grant, the City, and the County.			
Creating a plan is a heavy lift. Staff is glad to have the technical assistance included with the grant, but staff will rely on the commission and city council to provide direction on what the city should focus on and how to achieve success.
