Mayor Johnston called the Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Conlin, DeLapp, and Smith. ABSENT: Johnson. STAFF PRESENT: City Administrator Rafferty, City Planner Dillerud, Finance Director Bouthilet, Building Official McNamara, Fire Chief Malmquist, Parks Supt. Bouthilet, City Engineer Prew, City Attorney Filla, and Recording Secretary Freeman.

Pledge of Allegiance

1. AGENDA:

Additions: 7A (3) Park Use Preliminary Information; 9F METC meeting update, Changes: Moved 8C to Closed Session, moved 10A to Closed Session; Moved 7B (1) and 7B (2) to 3A (3).

M/S/P Conlin/DeLapp – to approve the September 5, 2006, City Council Agenda as amended. (Motion passed 4-0)

2. MINUTES:

M/S/P Smith/Conlin – to approve the August 15, 2006, City Council minutes as amended. (Motion passed 4-0)

3. PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL/PUBLIC INQUIRIES:

A. Public Informational:

(1) CIC Presentation on Senior Housing:

Brenda Anderson, from the Community Improvement Commission (CIC), presented the results from the Senior Housing Survey. Approximately one hundred surveys were received, with 86% believing that a need exists for senior housing. The CIC recommends that further study, feedback and direction from the City Council are necessary to identify appropriate senior housing suitable for the City of Lake Elmo.

Council Members questioned the "definition of affordable housing," and the probable cost of any senior oriented units/houses in the Old Village Area. It was determined that it would be best to have the Old Village Plan completed, and have any senior housing builders expressing interest work with the Engstrom group.

(2) <u>Lake Elmo Bank 95th Anniversary: Resolution 2006-094:</u>

The Mayor and City Council congratulated the owners and employees of the Lake Elmo Bank on their 95th Anniversary in the East Metro Area. They have been, and continue to be, an outstanding corporate citizen of Lake Elmo. There will be a Community Celebration on Friday, with Acting Mayor Smith presenting the City's congratulations.

M/S/P Smith/Conlin – to approve Resolution No. 2006-094, congratulating Lake Elmo Bank on its 95th Anniversary. (Motion passed 4-0)

B. Public Inquiries:

Julie Bunn, 2986 Lake Elmo Avenue, introduced herself and announced her candidacy for State Representative 56A.

Deb Krueger, 4452 Lake Elmo Avenue, requested that action be taken regarding the 43rd Street water main construction, stating that the City needs to adopt a code or policy for completion of any City project in a timely manner. She stated that this was her third request for the repair of the ditch on their property. She requested that this repair be delayed until Spring 2007 since the plant growth in the ditch now precludes an accurate assessment of the repairs required. She also reported that a load of gravel was required for their driveway and a survey marker needed replacement. She demanded that those actions be completed by the end of September.

City Engineer Prew stated that the contractor needs to inspect the property and have the survey stakes correctly placed.

M/S/P DeLapp/Smith – to direct Staff to make every reasonable effort to comply with Ms. Krueger's request for gravel and survey stake by the end of September 2006. (Motion passed 4-0)

M/S/P DeLapp/Conlin – to complete the ditch work by the Fall of 2006 or Spring 2007, being careful to avoid the months of November and December 2006 to avoid conflict with the Krueger's holiday tree sales. (Motion passed 4-0)

 Council discussed if it was wise to pay CB & I Constructors due to the outstanding issues about documentation on the water tower construction issues.

The City Attorney and Staff stated they are still clarifying the wording of the water tower guarantee document that the City has negotiated including the concerns addressed by the City Council. City Engineer Prew would report back to Council at a subsequent Council meeting.

M/S/P Smith/Johnston – to authorize payment of Certificate No. 6, to CB & I Constructors, in the amount of \$366,537.07, for the Elevated Water Storage Tank No. 2. (Motion passed 4-0)

H. Pay Estimate for Tablyn Park/Lake Elmo Heights

Council members discussed what a reasonable timeline was for the residents to expect the work to be completed, and whether payment should be made as the work was behind schedule. City Engineer Prew explained that he expected the middle of October for the work to be completed. A timeline schedule would be mailed to all residents this week.

M/S/P Johnston/DeLapp – to authorize the Partial Payment of Certificate No.2, to Park Construction Company, in the amount of \$537,058.69. (Motion passed 4-0)

I. Resolution No. 2006-090: Ordering Assessment Hearing for Water System

Interconnect Phase IV

M/S/P Smith/Johnston – to authorize the City to accept the proposed assessment of the cost of the Water System Interconnect Phase IV Project. (Motion passed 4-0)

J. Resolution No. 2006-091: Awarding Bid for 2006 MSA Resurfacing M/S/P Smith/Johnston – to award bid to Tower Asphalt, Inc., in the amount of \$236,501.45, for the 2006 MSA Resurfacing. (Motion passed 4-0)

5. FINANCE:

A. Resolution No. 2006-088: Budget Presentation: Adoption of Proposed Tax Levy and Proposed 2007 Budget

The Finance Director presented the 2007 Proposed Budget to the Council, stating that it has been reviewed with the Dept. Heads and City Administrator. The proposed Levy Certification must be approved by September 15, 2006. The Levy can always be lowered. The final budget must be certified to the County by December 29, 2006.

M/S/P Johnston/Conlin – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-088, for the Proposed 2006 Tax Levy, collectible in 2007 and the 2007 Proposed Budget. (Motion passed 3-1: DeLapp does not believe we can justify a 25% City tax revenue increase over 2 years)

B. Resolution No. 2006-089: Set Truth in Taxation Hearing Dates

M/S/P DeLapp/Smith – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-089, setting the Truth in Taxation

Public Hearing Dates for the 2006 Tax Levy and the 2007 Budget. (Motion passed 4-0)

6. NEW BUSINESS: None

7. MAINTENANCE/PARK/FIRE/BUILDING:

A. Parks Dept.:

(1) Carriage Station Basketball Court:

Public Works Superintendent reported that three quotes were received for the building/resurfacing of the new basketball court at Carriage Station. He reported that there are CIP funds set aside for this project and recommends awarding the bid to T.A. Schifsky, Inc.

M/S/P Smith/DeLapp – to award the bid to T.A. Schifsky, Inc., in the amount of \$12,500.00 per quote dated August 23, 2006, for a new Carriage Station basketball court at the enlarged size, per the recommendation of the Public Works Supervisor. (Motion passed 4-0)

(2) Announce Public Works Open House:

City Administrator Rafferty announced that an Open House will be held for the new Public Works Building on Saturday, September 16, 2006, from 9:00 am to Noon. Ribbon cutting will be at 9:30 a.m. The Public is welcome and invited to attend.

B. Fire Dept. Update:

(1) Recognize Explorers:

Chief Malmquist recognized Lake Elmo Volunteer Explorers Fire Post 9351 for their successes at the Eighth Annual Governor's Fire Safety Day. Explorers Sarah Gilder, Noah Malmquist, Jack Winkels, Tom Gagnon, Jessica Elliott, Ben Salus and Adam Heinle participated in the event.

(2) <u>Recognize Two Engineer Certified Firefighters:</u>
Training Officers - District Chief Brad Winkels and Captain Mike Tremain introduced Brian Johnson and Richie Springborn. They are the first Lake Elmo Firefighters to have successfully completed the Fire Engineer training in Lake Elmo.

(3) Fire Station No. 2 Upgrades:

The Fire Chief informed Council that bids were received for upgrades to Fire Station #2, approaching it as a two-part project. The first stage will be the degreasing and painting of the walls. Also, the floors would be cleaned, striped and sealed.

The second stage will be the construction of a "day room" in the center stall, improvement of storage space and upgrading the existing office space. The Firefighters have agreed to provide the labor for this project to minimize the costs. There will be expenses for materials, HVAC and some electrical work.

Mayor Johnston questioned the need for the second stage improvements. City Administrator Rafferty advised that this building will be usable for another 8-10 years, which warrants at least these minimal improvements to function as a fire station over that time period. Council Member DeLapp said he supported the upgrades, and he appreciated the time and effort the Firefighters were going to provide to completing the improvements.

M/S/P DeLapp/Johnston – to award the bid to Volk Contracting in the amount of \$8,250.00 for the painting and floor upgrade at Fire Station No. 2. Motion passed 4-0)

Following the motion and vote, the Fire Chief asked for clarification if that included authority for the Fire Department to buy the materials necessary to build the dayroom. It was suggested that it was included in the motion.

8. CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT:

A. Water Tower Paint Color (verbal):

City Engineer Prew requested confirmation from Council regarding the color of the new water tower, bowl, and the lettering. He recommended the bowl color be off-white, to match the pedestal, with maroon lettering to match the Public Works building.

Council discussed the various color options. Suggestions included trying to blend the tank into the landscape, the possibility of no lettering on the tower, and asking the community to propose what words/logos (if any) should be on the tank.

M/S/P Smith/Johnston – to paint the water tower base and bowl off-white, with burgundy lettering, per the City Engineer's recommendation. (Motion passed 3-1) DeLapp, too plain)

B. <u>28th Street Petition for Street Improvement (verbal):</u>
The City received a petition, dated August 24, 2006, signed by the residents on 28th Street, requesting the street be upgraded from gravel to blacktop.

Resident Robert Schumacher, 9155 28th Street, spoke in favor of the upgrade as the streets are being dug up for the water main project.

Resident Jim Petersen, 2751 Jamley Avenue North, agreed that the upgrade should be done now. Delaying the road upgrade would not be cost effective.

Resident Jim Palecek, 2798 Jamley Avenue North, spoke against the road upgrade. He does not want to be assessed for it just because part of his property abuts 28th Street.

City Engineer Prew requested direction from Council regarding the upgrading of 28th Street, south of the end of Jamley Avenue.

M/S/P Conlin/Smith – to direct the City Engineer to prepare a Feasibility Report, and to include the cost of a City standard street and with an alternative of an 18' wide road with a 6" gravel base, and bring back to the September 19, 2006, Council meeting. (Motion passed 4-0)

- C. <u>Northern Water Main Extension Easement Update (Handout at Meeting):</u>
 Moved to Closed Session
- D. <u>Tablyn Park/Lake Elmo Heights Water System Update (verbal):</u>
 City Engineer Prew stated that two-thirds of the water main was in place. He reported that approximately 25 property owners have not as yet responded to letters regarding connection to their homes, and that extra crews had arrived to assist with this project as work is slightly behind schedule. The City Engineer provided a handout indicating the timeline being followed by TKDA and the Contractor, with a copy of the timeline and letter to be mailed to the residents this week.

Resident George Heller, 8644 27th Street North, requesting clarification of the decision regarding whether open trenching or directional drilling is used for the service lines from the main to the home. The City Engineer explained that individual site circumstances determined the type of service line installation used—such as service line length, in place landscaping and existing trees.

9. PLANNING, LAND USE & ZONING:

A. Resolution No. 2006-092: Zoning Variance; Richard and Eileen Bergman: The City Planner reported that the Planning Commission recommended approval of a zoning variance to allow a second accessory structure on an RR zoned parcel. Here a barn structure is on an adjoining tax parcel, but was a part of the original homestead parcel. The applicant requests a variance to permit the barn to be detached from the adjacent parcel and added to the homestead parcel where an accessory structure is already in place. A major condition would be legally combining the additional 1.33 acres including the barn to the property with the homesteaded property.

Council Member DeLapp observed that if both parcels are owned by the same party, and one is non-conforming by area (as is the homestead parcel), the Code requires the parcels be combined and divided such that both are conforming in area – 10 acres in this case. He said he believes that Richard and Eileen Bergman own both parcels so a condition of the variance should be that the homestead parcel be enlarged to at least 10 acres.

The City Planner advised that while this is true, it has been his understanding that the homestead parcel was conveyed to a Bergman son.

Richard Bergman advised the Council that the homestead parcel was to be his son's, and that his son could not afford to purchase a full 10 acres – only the 1.33 acres needed to place the barn on the homestead parcel.

M/S/P Johnston/DeLapp – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-092, approving a zoning variance to locate two accessory buildings on a RR zoned parcel. (Motion passed 4-0)

B. <u>Apostolic Church Site: Resolution No. 2006-093: Comp Plan Amendment: Ordinance No. 97-178: Rezoning</u>

M/S/P Johnston/DeLapp – to table this item until the September 19, 2006, Council meeting when a full City Council will be in attendance. (Motion passed 4-0)

C. Status of Village Plan (verbal):

The City Planner reported that the Village Area Planning Team was under way with Phase 2 work following a lengthy contract preparation experience. He noted that meetings had already been held with the Allied Property Owners and City Staff, and that additional meetings are scheduled over the next several weeks with MPCA (treated TCE water discharge), MnDOT/Washington County (Highway 5 modifications) and the Allied Property Owners (clarification of the "Incentive Fund" components and, thereafter, specific unit count determination.) He also advised that the City Engineer has been requested to provide updated data regarding surface water (from that produced for the Thorbeck Plan), and to begin preliminary design of the sanitary sewer system.

D. Metropolitan Airport Commission – Lake Elmo Airport 2025 Plan:
The City Administrator, City Planner, Assistant Planner, and representatives from Baytown Township and West Lakeland Township attended at meeting with MAC staff and its consultants to discuss the Lake Elmo Airport Long Term (2025) Comprehensive Plan Update now underway.

MAC presented three draft alternative airport development concepts for inclusion of the 2025 updated place, and has requested comments from the City on the draft alternative airport development options. He noted that the local government representatives at the meeting agreed that a fourth alternative be "no further development at the airport."

M/S/P Johnston/DeLapp—to direct Staff to send a letter to MAC stating Lake Elmo City Council support of the fourth alternative—that be no further development at the Lake Elmo Airport (runways or hangers).

E. Xcel Fly Ash Landfill Siting:

The City Planner stated that Xcel is preparing a voluntary Environmental Impact Statement for a fly ash fill in West Lakeland Township. The first step in that process is the preparation of a Scoping Environmental Assessment Workshop (SEAW).

Mayor Johnston stated that as a result of the ground water contamination issues in Lake Elmo, which could also result from the fly ash fill, it is recommended that the City support any efforts with West Lakeland Township to defeat the Xcel efforts to place the

land fill in their township, as they are in a leadership position.

Council Member DeLapp questioned what zoning authority the County and the Township have respectively regarding a use like this. The City Planner reported that West Lakeland Township has the authority but the County has the authority to regulate land fills but Xcel's strategy is to process their fly ash project permitting as a mine reclamation CUP amendment through the County (which has authority regarding the mining CUP covering the proposed site) instead to avoid dealing with a township that is clearly opposed to the project. The County would have to amend its mining regulations to include a fly ash landfill as a permissible mine reclamation strategy. He stated that the SEAW pretty clearly spell out that Xcel strategy, in apparent belief that the County Board would support what the township would not.

The City Planner stated that Staff is requesting direction regarding if the City desires to comment to MPCA/ECO regarding the SEAW

City Council directed the City Planner to pursue a response to the SEAW and present alternatives or beneficial use of fly ash.

F. METC Update:

Council Member DeLapp requested clarification regarding the delay in meeting with the METC. He noted that the Council had agreed two months ago to set up a meeting once some issue had been resolved. He couldn't recall the issue. Council Member DeLapp said he has heard nothing about a meeting since then.

Mayor Johnston stated that the City would meet with METC only when a constructive agenda was developed. The City is still working on the zoning issues, and it is not yet ready.

Council Member DeLapp reminded Council that a vote was taken two months ago, that the City would meet with METC. It has not yet occurred and he asked what the delay was for.

Council Member Conlin reminded Council Member DeLapp that the City voted to meet with the METC, but would not go into the meeting without a set agenda. She also remembered that Mr. Georgecas would be setting the meeting.

M/S/P Johnston/Smith – to place the MET meeting on the September 13, 2006, Council Workshop and discuss the Agenda for the meeting. (Motion passed 4-0)

10. CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

A. Ziertman/Sessing Update: (verbal) Moved to Closed Session

11. CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

A. City Administrator Rafferty: None

12. CITY COUNCIL REPORTS:

A. Mayor Johnston reported that he attended the Rasmussen Business College Groundbreaking, and presented the ceremonial shovel to the City Administrator for use at the Public Works building.

Mayor Johnston also requested clarification of the Lights Out Policy regarding the VFW Field and policy of providing a port-a-potty at Carriage Station Park. He also provided an update from his AMM meeting regarding METC penalties imposed on Lake Elmo with the extension of the Comprehensive Plan submission.

STAFF PRESENT: City Administrator Rafferty, City Planner Dillerud, Finance Director Bouthilet, Building Official McNamara (left at 7:45 pm), Fire Chief Malmquist, (left at 7:30 p.m.) TKDA Engineer Stempski, City Attorney Filla, and Recording Secretary Freeman.

M/S/P Johnson/Smith – to approve the August 2, 2006, City Council minutes as amended. (Motion passed 3-0-2 Abstained Johnson and Colin-did not attend meeting)

3. PUBLIC INQUIRIES/INFORMATIONAL:

A. Public Informational: None

B. Public Inquiries:

David Frosch, 2935 Jonquil Trail, said he is a new Lake Elmo resident who is building houses in The Farms of Lake Elmo, and is requesting clarification of the Sign Ordinance regarding off-site real estate signs. He reported that he had been issued a permit for several Temporary off-site signs in the past, but was recently advised by City Staff that they would no longer issue any permits for off-site signage based on closer review of the Sign Ordinance. He said that he has seen many off-site real estate signs throughout the City. The Council directed Staff to review Mr. Frosch's concerns and report on off-site signage to the September 13, 2006, Council Workshop.

Nicole Park, 404 Lake Elmo Avenue, introduced herself and announced she would be running for City Council. Her goals for the City are to make Lake Elmo more of a destination, and to help establish a Family Center.

Susan Dunn, 11018 Upper 33rd Street, reminded the audience about the Budget meeting; the Water Contamination Meeting at OakLand Junior High School on September 14, 2006, at 6:00 p.m. Ms. Dunn also stated an update is needed on the new water tower being out-of-round and long-term stability, and requested information regarding the painting of the older water tower.

4. CONSENT AGENDA:

A. Resolution No. 2006-079:

M/S/P Smith/Johnson – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-079 approving Claim Number 341, 342, DD385 through DD847, 29494 through 29504, were used for Staff Payroll dated

August 3, 2006; 29505 through 29559, in the total amount of \$917,087.81 are hereby approved. (Motion passed 5-0)

B. Monthly Operating Report:

Mayor Johnston requested clarification of the Fiscal Disparities line item in the Report and the 2006 Comprehensive Plan Old Village design costs line item in the Report. Finance Director Bouthilet said Fiscal Disparities are a Metro commercial tax capacity redistribution law, where 40% of commercial tax capacity (and, therefore, ad valorem tax revenue) is, by legislatively mandated formula, moved into a Metro "Pool" from all cities and townships in the seven County Metro Area, and redistributed from the pool to these cities and townships, based on a formula designed to share commercial tax revenue relative to their overall tax capacity and population capacity. Lake Elmo gains a little annual revenue from the Fiscal Disparities Pool annually, which is reflected in the line item noted by Mayor Johnston.

Finance Director Bouthilet advised that the Village Area Planner expenditures need to be recoded out of the Planning Department budget and into the Village Area Planning Fund.

M/S/P Johnson/Conlin— to accept the July 2006 Monthly Operating Report. (Motion passed 5-0)

C. Resolution No. 2006-080: Partial Payment No. 5, Water Interconnect Project Phase III, Riley Brothers Construction:

M/S/P Smith/Johnson— to adopt Resolution No. 2006-080, authorizing Partial Payment No. 5, Water Interconnect Project Phase III, to Riley Brothers Construction, in the amount of \$178, 642.75. (Motion passed 5-0)

D. <u>Resolution No. 2006-081: Partial Payment No. 1, Tablyn Park/Lake Elmo Heights</u> Water Main, Park Construction:

M/S/P Smith/Johnson – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-81, authorizing Partial Payment No. 1, Tablyn Park/Lake Elmo Heights Water Main, to Park Construction, in the amount of \$627,532.95. (Motion passed 5-0)

7. MAINTENANCE/PARK/FIRE/BUILDING:

A. Building Dept. Update: Jim McNamara

Building Official McNamara reported that new residential starts have been much less than anticipated. He reminded the audience that heating systems should be checked and repaired prior to winter. Wood burning fireplaces and chimneys should also be inspected and cleaned if necessary.

B. Fire Dept. Update: Chief Malmquist

Fire Chief Malmquist informed Council that the Dept. visited three neighborhoods on National Night Out. He also thanked everyone for supporting the Pancake Breakfast during Huff'n'Puff days. He added that new members are always welcome and needed.

Fire Chief Malmquist introduced the three newest members: Paul Jorgensen, Noah Malmquist and Brad Asplund, and requested they be placed on probation.

M/S/P Smith/DeLapp – to approve Paul Jorgenson, Noah Malmquist and Brad Asplund as probationary members of the Lake Elmo Fire Dept. (Motion passed 5-0)

8. CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT:

A. Island Cul-de-Sacs in Tablyn Park

TKDA Engineer Stempski informed Council that a survey was conducted with the residents on 27th Street North (three) and 27th Street Court North (two), requesting their input regarding landscaped center island cul-de-sacs. The three questions per the resident survey were: 1) Are they in favor of a landscaped center island cul-de-sac? 2) Would they help plant and maintain? 3) What is their opinion on the City posting the cul-de-sacs "No Parking"? The three residents on 27th Street Court North were in favor and would help plant and maintain the island cul-de-sac. One resident was in favor, one opposed the parking restriction, and one suggested posting "No Parking" on one side only. One lot on the 27th Street North cul-de-sac is currently vacant, and the owner of the second lot was not in favor of the landscaped center island.

Council and Staff discussed various options of low maintenance vegetation, the paving of curb and gutter, and the alternative of a rain garden application, with curb and gutter around the island.

M/S/P Conlin/DeLapp – to direct Staff to prepare plans for the cul-de-sac at 27th Street North, and work with the three residents on curb and vegetation design. (Motion passed 5-0)

9. PLANNING, LAND USE & ZONING:

A. Resolution No. 2006-083: Variance for Septic Drainfield: 8320 Hidden Bay Trail, Swanson:

The City Planner reported that the Planning Commission recommended approval of the variance from drain field setback standards. The applicant seeks variances from drain field setback standards to the property line (3 feet where 10 feet is required) and an existing detached garage (3 feet where 20 feet is required). The variances relate to the applicants' failing septic systems needing a new drainfield in proximity of the existing drainfield. No reasonable alternative location was available for the new drainfield.

M/S/P Johnston/Johnson – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-083, approving the septic system setback variance at 8320 Hidden Bay Trail. (Motion passed 5-0)

B. Resolution No. 2006-084: CUP/Site Plan for Veterinary Clinic in GB Zone, 11051 Stillwater Blvd.-Dr. John Baillie and Gary T. Harty:

The City Planner reported that at the August 14, 2006, Planning Commission meeting, the applicant proposed relocation of the veterinary clinic from its present Lake Elmo Avenue location to the former Harty Insurance building on Stillwater Blvd. Applications for a Conditional Use Permit to locate the veterinary clinic in the GB zone and a Site Plan to modify the parking arrangement on the site have been presented to the City. A previously approved Site Plan (2005) to enlarge and remodel this site has been abandoned earlier by those applicants. The City Planner reported that the Planning Commission recommends approval of the proposed resolution of the Conditional Use Permit and Site Plan subject to several conditions.

M/S/P DeLapp/Johnson – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-084, granting a Conditional Use Permit for Veterinary Services and the Section 520 Site Plan for site modifications to Dr. John Baillie and Gary Harty at 11051 Stillwater Blvd. based on Findings and recommendation of the Planning Staff Report and plans Staff dated August 9, 2006, and with the nine Conditions in the Resolution. (Motion passed 5-0)

C. Resolution No. 2006-085: Final Plat of Eagle Point Business Park; Resolution No. 2006-086: Shoreland Variance and Section 520 Site Plan for C & C North America: The City Planner reported that the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of a Section 520 Site Plan and Shoreland variance for construction of a 25,000 square foot office/showroom building on a 2.04 acre parcel of the Eagle Point Business Park. The approval recommendation included eight design-related conditions involving parking and stream bank landscape mitigation.

Council Member DeLapp asked why the applicant could not build a facility in compliance with Code on a newly platted lot. The response was that the proposed business owner wants a larger building than will fit without special consideration .

The City Planner also reported that the Planning Commission recommended approval of the final platting of Eagle Point Business Park Outlot C as Lot 1, Block 1, Eagle Point Business 6th Addition. No reasons were given.

M/S/P DeLapp/Smith – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-085, approving the Final Plat of Eagle Point Business Park 6th Addition. (Motion passed 5-0)

M/S/P DeLapp/Smith – to adopt Resolution No. 2006-086, approving the Section 520 Site Plan for C & C North America and Shoreland variance on Outlot C, Eagle Point Business Park, with the additional condition as follows: Comply with the Business Park District Performance Standards with respect to exterior surfaces. (Motion passed 5-0)

D. <u>Apostolic Bible Church Site – Comprehensive Plan Amendment & Rezoning:</u> M/S/P Smith/Conlin – to table this item at the request of the property owner until the September 5, 2006, Council Meeting, at which time the Apostolic Bible Church will be prepared to make a statement. (Motion passed 5-0)

E. Zoning Ordinance Interpretation – Non-Conforming AG Accessory Building: The City Planner reviewed with the Council the current Zoning Ordinance language regarding the allowable accessory building square footage in the various zoning districts. He reported that there was disagreement as to exactly how to interpret the language of the Non-Conforming AG zoning portion the accessory building standards as to whether the total allowable accessory building area is a sum of two buildings or each of two buildings. The Planning Commission recommended an interpretation as each of two buildings, based on overall code enforcement.

Council Member DeLapp based his support of the Planning Commission recommendation on overall Code consistency rather than the strict wording of the Ordinance.

M/S/P DeLapp/Johnson – to approve the interpretation of the terms "total area" contained within the "Agricultural – Non-conforming" paragraph of the table in Section 300.07 Subd. 4.B.2.b. of the City code to mean area of each of two buildings rather than an area as the sum of two buildings for both acreage levels. (Motion passed 5-0) Staff agreed to pursue the necessary language changes in the Zoning Ordinance to clearly reflect the foregoing interpretation ordinance.

F. Ordinance No. 97-176: Lateral Water Main Connection; Ordinance No. 97-177: Lateral Water Main Connection Charges for Phases I and II:

The City Planner explained the differences between trunk water charges and lateral water charges. The City Planner that the existing Code is confusing and not what was intended. He said that the Staff recommends adoption of the two ordinances: one to re-word the Code regarding WAC/lateral water charges, and one to establish water lateral charges for the Interconnect Projects I and II. The Council directed that the ordinances clearly specify that any additional charges added to deferred connections reflect the City's costs to carry, such as interest on bonds sold.

M/S/P DeLapp/Johnson – to adopt Ordinance No. 97-176, amending Chapter 600 of the City Code regarding charges for connection to City water. (Motion passed 5-0)

M/S/P DeLapp/Johnson – to adopt Ordinance No. 97-177, establishing lateral charges for City Water Interconnect Projects I and II. (Motion passed 5-0)

10. CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT: None

11. <u>CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:</u> A. <u>Tank Industries and Water Tower – update</u>

The City Administrator reported to Council the status of the proposed repair of the new water tower concrete support shaft, and reported that the specialized design consultant stated the support would be acceptable, subject to several conditions included in his letter to the City and it being structurally sound. The City Administrator and Engineer confirmed that a special ring had been designed to correct the out-of-round issue, and the repair work has been approved by TKDA. The work will carry a total of a 10-year warranty, with 5 years maintenance after the tank is at full capacity. All inspections will

be completed by an independent contractor.

Members of City Council noted several serious inconsistencies between the recommendations in the consultant's letter and the contractor's letter in response. The Staff was directed to enforce the consultant's recommendations.

B. Old Village Plans - update:

The City Planner informed Council that a meeting with the Planning Team was scheduled for Friday, August 18, 2006. He will report to Council about the status of the Village Area Plans at the September 5, 2006, Council meeting.

12. <u>CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS AND REPORTS:</u>

A. Mayor Johnston: Continues to work on AMM committees and Metropolitan Agencies Committee. St. Croix Regional Family Center survey conducted and the location will be announced September 13, 2006. There is no tax burden to the city selected, and a YMCA would be built a few years later.

Council discussed the question of which school districts were surveyed and if it would be impact the site selection process.

- C. Council Member DeLapp: Noted that an amendment to State Statutes regarding annexation passed the 2006 Legislature, requiring both cities' approval where detachment from one city and concurrent annexation to another city is petitioned. In the past a single city coveting the land/tax base of a neighbor could petition and have annexation approved without the consent of the city that would lose the lands. He observed that this legislation appeared to be a change of course for the Legislature by inserting more local autonomy in city/city annexation issues, and that, perhaps, is a signal that the Legislature may be more responsive to local autonomy issues involving the Met Council.

i. <u>INTRODU</u>CTION

A petition was received by the City of Lake Elmo requesting the paving of 28th Street North. The City Clerk verified the petition and it was presented at the September 5, 2006 City Council Meeting. Council direction, at that meeting, was to prepare a Feasibility Report to pave 28th Street North.

II. INITIATION

The City Council initiated this Project. A 4/5th's vote of the City Council is necessary to order this Project.

EXISTING CONDITIONS

The street currently is gravel surfaced, it varies in width from 22 feet at the intersection with Jamley Avenue, down to a single driveway width at the ends. There are six houses and one undeveloped lot which use the street for access.

The street has never been improved to City standards. It has recently had a watermain installed. There is no storm sewer, or well defined ditches.

III. <u>IMPROVEMENT</u>

There is 33 feet of Right-of-Way along this roadway, which is approximately half of the typical Right-of-Way for a standard municipal street. This reduced Right-of-Way eliminates the possibility of a turn-around being constructed. Because a turn-around cannot be built, the minimum street width recommended is 22 feet. This width will allow snow plows and other large vehicles to more easily back-up. The north edge of the pavement would be 3 feet off of the northern Right-of-Way line.

The roadway would be constructed to the City standard section of 12 inches of Class 5 aggregate base, 1.5 inches of bituminous non-wear, and 1.5 inches of bituminous wear. Further soil investigation would be necessary to determine if additional soil correction measures are needed.

The western portion of the road appears to have very soft soils, and does flood during some springs. It is not proposed to pave this portion of the street because of these factors.

No ponding or other storm water treatment is planned, due to the narrow Right-of-Way.

City Council has also requested that a cost estimate be prepared for a road section of 6 inches of Class 5 aggregate base, 2 inches of bituminous wear, and 18 feet wide. This estimate is also included in the Appendix.

IV. PERMITS AND APPROVALS

None.

V. <u>ESTIMATED PROJECT COSTS</u>

The prices quoted herein are from Park Construction Company's Unit Prices provided for the Tablyn Park/Lake Elmo Heights Watermain Extension project. A detailed cost estimate is located in the Appendix.

VI. PROJECT FINANCING

This Project will be financed by assessments to benefiting properties, and a General Fund Contribution. Funding from our Grant from 3M for the watermain project would cover about \$7,000 of the cost.

Because this project is not in the City's Capitol Improvement Plan, there is no funds budgeted for this project in 2006.

VII. PROJECT ASSESSMENTS

This street has not previously been upgraded to City Standards. The City needs to determine an assessment rate for the project.

Recent appraisals by the City have shown that the increase in value for an upgraded road for a neighborhood such as this is about \$2,500.00 per buildable lot.

The City may also choose to assess the full value of the project to the benefiting properties, since there has been no previous road built here.

ASSESSMENT OPTION 1:

Base on an assessment of \$2,500.00 to each buildable lot which uses this street, the City would collect \$17,500.00. The City would contribute the remaining \$41,000.00

ASSESSMENT OPTION 2:

Entire project cost to be assessed equally to each buildable lot. Allowing for the contribution from 3M, this would yield an assessment rate of \$8,300 per buildable lot.

VIII. RIGHT-OF-WAY

No additional Right-of-Way is required.

X. STATEMENT OF FEASIBILITY

The construction of the street improvements considered in this Feasibility Report are feasible from an Engineering standpoint. The economic feasibility is to be determined by the City Council and residents involved.

XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

- We recommend the City proceed with the option of a 22-foot wide street on a standard city street section. The project should be done in phases, with the existing Contractor placing the gravel base. This will allow any settling to occur over the winter.
- Next summer the paving would be completed under a separate bid.
- It is recommended that the assessments be set at \$2,500 per unit.

<u>General No Parking Regulations</u>. The following is a summary of the provisions of Minnesota Statutes Section 169.041 which would apply to vehicles and trailers in the City of Lake Elmo:

TOWING

- 1. Towing Order Required. The City may not tow a motor vehicle or trailer from public property unless the City's law enforcement officer has prepared, in addition to the parking citation, a written towing report describing the motor vehicle or trailer and the reasons for towing. The report must be signed by the officer and the tow driver.
- 2. Four (4) Hour Waiting Period. The City may not tow, or allow or require the towing of a motor vehicle or trailer from public property for a parking or traffic violation until four (4) hours after the issuance of a traffic ticket or a citation, except as hereinafter provided:
 - (a) The vehicle is parked in violation of snow emergency regulations;
 - (b) The vehicle is parked in a rush hour restricted parking area;
 - (c) The vehicle is blocking a driveway, alley or fire hydrant;
 - (d) The vehicle is parked in a bus lane, or at a bus stop, during hours when parking is prohibited.
 - (e) The vehicle is parked within thirty (30) feet of a stop sign and visually blocking the stop sign;
 - (f) The vehicle is parked in a handicap transfer zone or handicapped parking space without a handicapped parking certificate or handicapped license plate;
 - (g) The vehicle is parked in an area that has been posted for temporary restricted parking at least twelve (12) hours in advance;
 - (h) The vehicle is parked within a right of way of a controlled access highway or within the traveled portion of a public street when travel is allowed there;
 - (i) The vehicle is unlawfully parked in a zone that is restricted by posted signs to use by fire, police, public safety or emergency vehicles;
 - (j) A law enforcement official has probable cause to believe that the vehicle is stolen, or that the vehicle constitutes or contains evidence

- of a crime and impoundment is reasonably necessary to obtain or preserve the evidence.
- (k) The driver, operator, or person in physical control of the vehicle is taken into custody and the vehicle is impounded for safekeeping;
- (l) A law enforcement official has probably cause to believe that the owner, operator, or person in physical control of the vehicle has failed to respond to five or more citations for parking or traffic offenses;
- (m) The vehicle is unlawfully parked in a zone that is restricted by posted signs to use by taxicabs;
- (n) The vehicle is unlawfully parked and prevents egress by a lawfully parked vehicle;
- (o) The vehicle is unlawfully parked, on a school day during prohibited hours, in a school zone on a public street where official signs prohibit parking;
- (p) The vehicle is a junk, abandoned or unauthorized vehicle, as defined in Minnesota Statutes Section 168B.011, and subject to immediate removal under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 168B; or
- (q) The vehicle is located so as to constitute an accident or traffic hazard to the traveling public, as determined by the City's law enforcement agency.

CITY OF LAKE ELMO WASHINGTON COUNTY STATE OF MINNESOTA

ORDINANCE NO. 97-179

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TOWING OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VECHILES AND TRAILERS

The Lake Elmo City Council hereby ordains that Sections 100.06 Subd. 1 and Subd. 2 and Section 1000.01 are amended; and that Section 100.06 Subd. 5, Section 1005.01 Subd. 3 and 1005.045 and its subdivisions are hereby added to the City Code to read as follows:


- 100.06
- Subd. 1 Petty Misdemeanor. Whenever an action or omission is declared by this Code to be a petty misdemeanor, any person violating the provision shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not more than \$300.00, plus the cost of prosecution
- Subd. 2 Misdemeanors. Unless another penalty is expressly provided in this Code, any person violating any provision of this Code, or any rule or regulation adopted in pursuance thereof or any other provision of any code adopted in this Code by reference, including any provisions declaring an act or omission to be a misdemeanor shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or imprisonment for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both, plus, in either case, the cost of prosecution.
- Subd. 5 Miscellaneous Fines. Any person who violates the provisions of Section 1005.045 shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$150.00 nor more than \$300.00, plus the cost of prosecution.
- Adoption of Highway Traffic Regulations. The regulatory provisions and definitions of MS Chapter 169, the Highway Traffic Regulation Act, and of MS Chapter 168B are, by this Section, adopted as the traffic code and parking regulations for the use of highways, streets, alleys and other portions of the City and are, by this Section, incorporated in and made a part of this Code. The parking provisions shall apply to the parking of trailers as well as vehicles.




Existing No Parking Locations in Tri Lakes Area

Conditions appear to have changed from those existing at the time of the 1989 Comprehensive Plan Amendment classifying the site as PF. Location: 8890 10th Street North

Requested Action: Comprehensive Plan Amendment and Rezoning

Land Use Plan Guiding: PF

Existing Zoning: PF

Site History and Existing Conditions:

City records regarding this 38 acre (overall) site date back to 1988. The site owner (Apostolic Bible Church) applied to the City to rezone the entire 38 acres from RR (Rural Residential) to PF (Public/Semi-Public Facilities) with the specific intent to build a church. There were also indications that the applicant may include a seminary facility on the site.

No application or discussion of a corresponding Comprehensive Plan amendment appears in the 1988/1989 records of this proceeding, except reference to a clause in the City Zoning Ordinance (that remains to this day as 301.060 E.8) stating that a rezoning action automatically amends the Comprehensive Plan to conform with the zoning. While that may have been the understanding of the City at that time (Comp Plan responds to zoning), Minnesota court decisions (and Statute amendments) that may have taken place subsequent to 1988/1989 clearly prescribe that zoning must respond to the Comp Plan. Hence (at least today) there can be no rezoning that is inconsistent with the Land Use Plan. Today, the Plan must be amended first.

Following initial review, Public Hearing and discussion at the Planning Commission level the applicant amended the rezoning application to reduce the area of the requested action to the westerly 13 + acres (net of road right-of-way) of the 38+ acre site. Although the Planning Commission recommended denial of the application, the City Council did eventually approve it and a related land division. That land division is not, however, of record with Washington County.

In 1991 the property owner (Apostolic Church) was asked by the City if they intended to proceed with the church project to which they responded in the affirmative, but that construction would not start until at least 1994. This inquiry by the City was initiated responsive to a suggestion that the land be rezoned back to RR since no church construction had taken place.

In 1998 the church advised the City that it planned to move forward with church construction during 1998. This may have been responsive to concurrent work by the City to amend the PF zoning district standards in a manner that was viewed by this church (and others) as constraining. Those PF amendments were eventually adopted by the City. There has been no contact of the City by the church regarding building plans since at least 2000.

Discussion and Analysis:

The City Council has recently directed Staff to process a City Council-initiated Comprehensive Plan amendment for the subject 13+ acres to reclassify the Plan land use from PF to RAD – consistent with the surrounding lands. The Council also initiated a complimentary rezoning process for the site to reclassify zoning from PF to RR – again consistent with surrounding properties. The property owner (and property owners within 350 feet of the site) have been notified of the proposed actions.

Comprehensive Plan amendments are generally based on one or both of the following:

- 1. A change of conditions regarding the subject site, or the surrounding area.
- 2. An error in the existing Plan classification.

Staff review of the substantial records regarding the 1988/1989 proceedings that lead to the rezoning of this site from RR to PF reveal (as noted above) that there was no discussion of the Comprehensive Plan amendment except the reference to the "zoning equals Plan" clause of the Zoning Ordinance. No findings regarding either change of conditions or error supported that Plan amendment – rather, a basic determination of whether it was the "right" or "wrong" action by the City based on a substantially different understanding of the importance of comprehensive plans that cities are required by Statute to adopt in 2006.

Staff concedes the advantages of 20/20 hindsight as we address the land use guiding and zoning of this site today – 17 years after the action. There were no specific findings (reflected in Minutes) in support of the 1989 action to assist in determining the reasons for the actions – beyond the applicant's ownership of the site – no error claimed, nor any change of conditions claimed (other than site ownership). Today, that alone could easily be construed as an error in the 1989 action, and the basis to return the site to RAD land use classification and RR zoning that the site held prior to the 1989 action to rezone (and automatically reclassify in the Comp Plan).

As the City has witnessed during the recent consideration of the Lakewood Church Comp Plan Amendment and rezoning applications, PF land use guiding and zoning tends to be a special case that is not easily addressed by planning theory or practice. Predeterming the need for and geographic placement of the PF-type uses as Comprehensive Plans are prepared is seldom accomplished, except in the case of large PUD projects (often hundreds of acres). In those cases the project alone may suggest PF needs (such as schools) and even church sites by mere project scale. Beyond that, PF land use decisions (other than accommodating existing PF uses) becomes an ad hoc practice based as much on judgment by planners and policy makers as on factual circumstances.

Findings and Recommendations:

Staff suggests the following Findings be considered regarding the City Council initiated application for amendment of the Comprehensive Plan to reclassify this site from PF to RAD:

1. The subject site is a 13 acre "island" of PF surrounded by RAD land use guiding — essentially "spot guiding" with no factual basis to support the existing PF classification, and RAD land use guiding continues to surround the site on 3 sides.

2. The record of the 1989 City action to reclassify the site from RAD to PF fails to provide Findings to support that reclassification beyond the interests of the property owner leading to the conclusion that an error may have resulted by the action.

3. There has been no evidence that the property owner intends to execute development of the site as a church during the past 7+ years. Conditions appear to have changed from those existing at the time of the 1989 Comprehensive Plan amendment classifying the site as PF. The property owner has been officially notified of this pending amendment, and has not responded.

Based on the foregoing, staff recommends the Comprehensive Plan be amended for this site to reclassify the site in the Land Use Plan from PF to RAD, subject to the Metropolitan Council concurrence mandated by State Statute.

Staff further recommends that the subject site be rezoned form PF to RR on the condition that the recommended Comprehensive Plan amendment is adopted by the City Council and concurred in by the Metropolitan Council.






